Dear Mr. Rabinovich,

Thank you for your letter of the 21st and for sending a copy of my comment on the Barkham "review" of my FRAME-UP to him.

I had asked, and hoped, for more. His work is syndicated. I know nothing about the syndicate, not even its identity. Therefore, I had ask that you forward it to the syndicate.

If this leaves it entirely up to Mr. Barkham, it may be unfair to him, for I have charged that his writing was both dishonest and of dishonest intent and that he in no way really represented the book he axed in the guise of a review. If, as I believe, I am correct, is it reasonable to expect him to say so? I think not.

And, as I tried to say, I think this subject is one that should not be handled in this fashion - especially when it is known that works in support of the newest official mythology, with enormous investments in them and the inevitable large promotional efforts, are scheduled.

A press conference for me will soon be held in New York. I believe the tentative date is May 4. I hope you can arrange to cover, with an unbiased reporter. I expect to have topical documents available at that time.


