While the maskings are much less injudicious and there are none about which I'd make an issue, they did mask the name of Father Groppi.

There are references to records not provided, two I recall from the first of the four sections. Probably more but these two seem likely to be of interest to me. One has two parts, a Memphis airtel and LHM of 3/28/68. The other is also from Memphis, of 2/16/68. They are referred to in serial 2X. If they are in a different Section I did not spot them.

Of historical interest there is reference to a response from Yeagley of ISD on the Bureau's inquiry about prosecutions. The date given for his missing response is 6/4/69.

I have not yet gotten to the Sanitation strike records. There is in these four Sections but a single reference to a union representative other than from Memphis. An international representative is identified as Bill Lucy. The second reference to him states he is a black man.

There are a couple of references to the first demonstration King led in Memphis. It was on 3/18/68. But there is no reference to his leading it or even being there.
