Andrew Sciambra and I interviewed MARGARET HEINDEL at her residence located at 2026 Robert Street in this city. The interview took place at about 7:00 P.M. on February 8, 1967. MARGARET HEINDEL is an elderly white female and she lives alone. For this reason she did not let us enter her home, but spoke to us from inside her house with the door securely chained. There are no other Heindels in the city related to her. No men in her family were in the armed services. Further, her son left the city in 1929 and he has never returned here to live. MARGARET HEINDEL was very guarded with us and would not elaborate on anything. I don't think she was trying to hide anything. She was obviously anxious over two strange men coming to her door at night since she lived in the house by herself.
