ON JANUARY 19, 1967

Saturday, January 21

As a result of locating the firing range near Slidell and on the road to the airstrip, I proceeded to investigate this site accompanied by two others.

The purpose of this trip was to possibly find old cartridges of 6.5mm, 38 cal., 30 cal. and any other type that may have been fired at this site.

I was able to locate cartridges which appeared to be of the above types and some of which appeared to have been there for some time.

Sunday, January 22

In an attempt to locate more cartridges at the site of this range, a search was made by myself, Fenner Sedgebeer, Charles Jonau, Jim Conway, and David Levy.

The search concerned itself with both sides of the range, as the range is divided by the road. All of the cartridges which were found were turned over to Louis Ivon upon our return.

We had the occasion to speak with a young white male who told us that this range was used by various clubs and people all the time. Also, that many people come to the range to pick up cartridges either to re-load or to sell. He said that he had lived near there for nine years and that when he first moved there, he and his brother had picked up over two thousand cartridges and sold them. He could give no information about a group shooting there, other than the fact that gun clubs come there to shoot.
