two months. [redacted] was released before him, and [redacted] was released only recently. While in jail, he overheard no conversation between [redacted] and [redacted] regarding RAY. He advised at that time [redacted] and [redacted] were in jail for the burglary of Art's Tavern, Soulard and South 11th Streets.

He recalls that sometime ago, the exact date unknown to him, [redacted] and someone else went to Arkansas to rob a variety store. They had previously cased this store. [redacted] recalled that they did not rob this store as they had planned for some reason unknown to him.

Regarding the financial status of [redacted] advised that [redacted] generally has a couple of hundred dollars with him all the time. He stated that [redacted] receives a Government check and plays cards frequently. He advised that [redacted] also has an account at Manufacturer's Bank on South Broadway.

[redacted] advised that [redacted] has no telephone, but frequently goes out to make telephone calls at a pay phone located in front of a Catholic church at 12th and Lafayette, St. Louis.

It is his opinion that [redacted] would not tell the FBI where RAY is, even if he knew. He stated that [redacted] is "a little nuts." He stated he believes this because of the fact that [redacted] keeps approximately fifteen cats in his home and one dog. [redacted] kisses the cats and refers to them as "baby." He stated that [redacted] sleeps with all the cats and his dog.

[redacted] described [redacted] as a "loud mouth, who would come in on anybody." He stated that he is sure that [redacted] would tell the FBI if he had any knowledge of RAY.
