

Left-Right Goff Gets a Job

tributor to Gerald L. K.
Smith's *The Cross and the Flagg*,
has a new job. He's been chosen
chairman of the National Youth
Organization, formed to combat the
Communist influence on U. S.
youth.

The group was launched at
Englewood, Col., by a delegation
of 350 pastors and representatives
of youth organizations. The rally-
ing cry was sounded by the Rev.
Harvey H. Springer, editor of *The
Western Voice*, who has raised
funds in behalf of Gerald B. Win-
rod, anti-Semitic Kansas publisher
and one of the alleged seditionists
now awaiting trial.

The organization was given a
rousing send-off in Springer's *Voice*
and Smith's magazine. Smith, De-
troit rabble-rouser and national di-
rector of the America First Party,
said the group would "combat the
underground conspiracy being di-

rected by the Communist Party
among young people."

Goff joined the Young Commu-
nist League nine years ago as a
"youth" and stayed with it four
years. He must have absorbed a
lot; in 1939 he told the Dies Com-
mittee all about the Communists,
to the tune of 130 pages of tes-
timony.

When Goff switched his stand,
he went whole hog and became a
contributor to Smith's and Spring-
er's publications. For *The Cross
and the Flagg* (August, 1943) he
wrote a confession entitled *I Was
a National Leader in the Commu-
nist Party, Now I Am a Christian*.
