I was surprised to read that Life had some special copies about the killing, so I wrote to them, and asked them to send these copies to me, with, of course, the bill.

However they told me after 7 (!) months that these copies were not available.

I don't know if this is the true reason.

That's why I'm writting to you with this question: Do you know how and where I can obtain these articles and/or photo's?

Dear Mr. Hovinga,

You do not provide the date of the special edition of LIFE but I rather suspect that you have in mind something done in the magazine after it was closed down and then started up again. If this is so, I have no knowledge of it but I am confident that no new photographs appeared in it.

In the fall of 1967 there was a special article in the old LIFE. It concluded that a new investigation then was needed. But it also had no new photos.

To the best of my recollection, no new photos have come to light in many years.

With regard to photos of which you know, I'm sorry that aside from any news agencies holding rights to them, like AP and UPI, I know of no source for them now. Once they were available from groups that no longer exist now.
