

Polish Assail Danes' Refusal To Extradite in Hijack Case

WARSAW, Sept. 8 (Reuters) — Poland said today that Denmark's refusal to extradite a 28-year-old man who is accused of having hijacked an airliner would not contribute to combating air piracy.

The official press agency, P.A.P., accused Denmark of inconsistency in refusing to send back Zbigniew Iwanicki, who hijacked a Polish airliner to Copenhagen June 5. In the past there have been numerous Danish statements condemning acts of air piracy and calling for severe punishment for the hijackers, P.A.P. said.

The hijacker forced the plane to break off an internal flight and fly to Copenhagen by threatening the crew with hand grenades.
