Typical of the continuing suppression is the withholding of the paragraph from David Slawson's 3/12/54 TOP SECRET memo on a CIA conference: "The first topic of conversation was Yuri Mosenko, the recent Soviet defector. A general discussion was held on this problem isig with the CIA's recommendation being that the Commission await further developments."
