RE: Professor Reisman

I called Ruth Paine this afternoon. She reported that until I mentioned it, she had never heard of the name Reisman and that she did not know a professor by that name or any similar name at Tulane.

She said that Mrs. Kloepfer, who was secretary of the Friends Meeting in New Orleans and whose name she had obtained by inquiry to the Dallas Friends Meeting, and to whom she wrote requesting that Mrs. Kloepfer make inquiry of the Oswalds and help them get acquainted in the community, had a husband who was connected with Tulane University. She did not know the capacity in which the husband served Tulane University.

I indicated that Professor Reisman was a man who had a daughter who was studying at the University of Moscow or at least in some university in Moscow. Mrs. Paine responded that she knew no one, leastwise a Professor Reisman, who had a daughter who was studying in Russia in 1963, either in Moscow or elsewhere.

She repeated that testimony she gave that when she arrived in New Orleans in September of 1963, she telephoned Mrs. Kloepfer and that in response to that telephone call Mrs. Kloepfer and her two daughters came by to pay a visit at the Oswalds' home on Magazine Street. Mrs. Paine understood from Mrs. Kloepfer and the two girls that one of the girls had just returned from Europe after an extended tour. However, Mrs. Paine's impression was that the tour was a summer vacation variety rather than anything connected with university study either anywhere in Europe or in this country.
