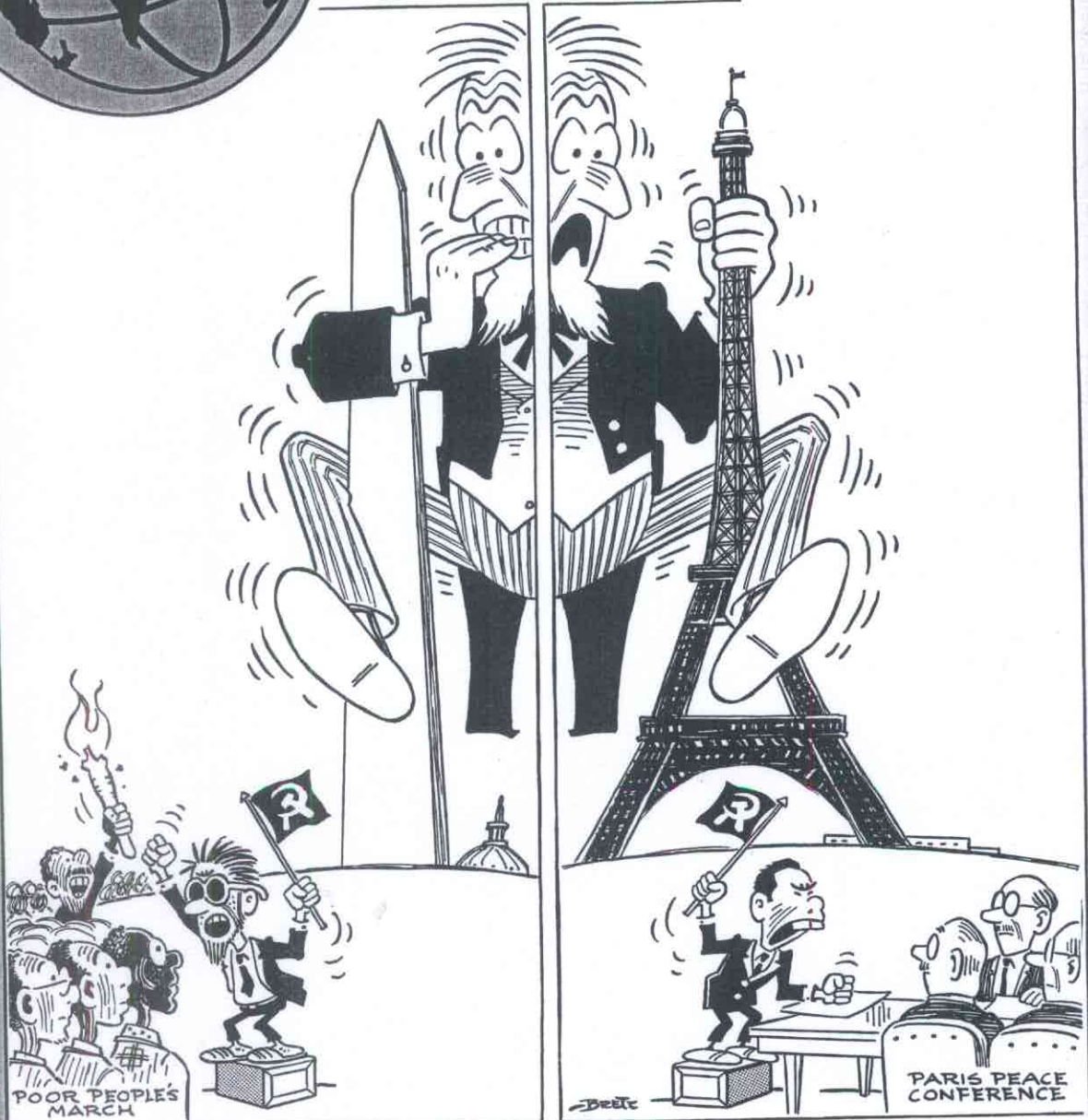

OPEN LETTER

Dear Readers:

This issue of *INSIGHT On The News* marks our first year of publication. There were those who insisted we could not do it, but our friends, the ones who share with us the inspiration to serve our cause, have supported our joint endeavor and have made it possible for *INSIGHT* to be a success. It has been a hard road to travel and the end is not yet in view, but I am confident that we will continue to improve and better our intelligence report, until it is as consolidated as any of the most widely-circulated Liberal news magazines. I have no doubts that we can excel the Liberals and the Leftists in hard work, dedication and zeal.

As many of you know, we stated in the first issue of *INSIGHT* that more than just a simple news magazine, we wanted to make our publication an "Intelligence Report." Perhaps there are some of you who would like to know if there is a difference between one and the other. The reply, naturally, is a emphatic YES!

An intelligence report should inform its readers on vital facts and key issues not generally brought forth or covered in the usual newsmedia sources. It should tell you today what may happen tomorrow, or several months from now. This can only be accomplished by thoroughly researching, studying, analyzing and evaluating what news makers think, say and do. It requires a study of the personal background of these news makers and, also, an analysis of the geography of news events.

One must be informed on the different aspects of geopolitics, that is, politics in relation to geography. Very frequently, a geographical factor, per se, is prone to make news. Thus we note how areas of the world such as the Panama Canal, the Gulf of Aqaba, the Suez Canal, the Gulf of Mexico and other places, are neuralgic zones from a news-producing viewpoint. For centuries, the Dardanelles were natural sources of news production due to the terrific political forces aspiring for their control and domination. Therefore, this is all part and parcel of the news evaluation which goes into the publishing of an intelligence report.

Principally, it is people who make news and amazingly enough, in proportion to the overall population of the world, the people who make news are few in number. It is not too difficult to keep an eye on them and frequently even forecast what they will do; that is, how at some future date they will "be in the news."

If you will look back at our first issue in January 1968, you will note that we forecast that there would be "peace talks" and "negotiations" on Vietnam several months before the Presidential elections. We added that the man who would head the team of U.S. negotiators would be "ace" trouble-shooter Averell Harriman. How did we know that this was going to occur? It was simple! Almost unnoticed by the national newsmedia, and virtually ignored by the general public, President Johnson, more than a year and a half ago, named Harriman to be his spokesman, when and if negotiations should take place. It was obvious then that if Vietnam was a "political war" as the President and the Administration have always claimed, its solutions, or attempts at solution, by "our side" would be based on political expediency, and not either moral or military factors.

President Johnson and his Liberal entourage have consistently claimed they did not want to "win" the war. They have demanded the sacrifice of American and South Vietnamese lives only to negotiate the war into a face-saving stalemate.

Red China has sworn that the Vietnamese war is being fought by President Johnson and his Administration only to serve the ultimate objectives of the Soviet Union in Asia. Such a statement is not at all far-fetched. We have witnessed how some of our most erudite politicians and Liberal pundits have gone as far as becoming irritated at Red China for halting Soviet military convoys traveling through Chinese territory, headed for Ho's land. It is a firmly entrenched tenet of U.S. Foreign policy that, in some mysterious way only a Liberal mind can comprehend, Red China is the "aggressor nation" which we must fear, while the Soviet Union is a "mellowing" foe with which we can reach, in the foreseeable future, an amicable "accommodation." Perhaps this may explain why since 1945, with possibly two or three exceptions, our foreign policy invariably winds up serving the Russian Soviet cause. Witness all of East Europe, the Baltic nations and other peoples abandoned by us to the tender mercies of Soviet domination and influence, notwithstanding an initial position on our part to defend the peoples' freedoms and sovereignties of these ill-fated human beings.

INSIGHT affirmed that Guevara was alive when almost everyone else said he was dead. We predicted General Westmoreland's substitution by General Abrams almost three full months

Anarchy—U.S.A.

Throughout the years, no other U.S. legislator has excelled Congressman James B. Utt, of California, in pinpointing the tragic forces conspiring to completely undermine and destroy America. In "Anarchy—U.S.A." The dignity and ruggedness of the individual have become submerged in collectivism, group dynamics, mass psychosis, humanism, and biochemistry, culminating in group self-criticism. All of this is aimed at destroying the independence, the self-confidence and self-reliance of the individual, which have always constituted the solid foundation of liberty, justice, and good government.

All of this was never more evident than the Pavlovian reaction of the American people following the death of Martin Luther King.

which produce a dialectical materialism, aimed at the complete subversion of a great people. The campus demonstrations, the defiance of law and order, the destruction of property, both public and private, are manifestations of this sickness now sweeping America. It is this sickness that is bringing the so-called "Poor People's March" on Washington, headed by Ralph Abernathy and his cabal of trouble-makers. They intend to blackmail and black-jack the Congress into complete submission. Regretfully, too many featherlegged politicians are caving in on every side. People are too willing to believe that property rights should be taken without due process of law or just compensation, as provided in the 5th Amendment to the Constitution.

We in Washington are facing an invasion intended to overthrow the government by force and violence. The doctrine of "non-violence" is as phony as a three-dollar bill, and falls in the category

of dialectical materialism. The instructions of Lenin were to proceed in a non-violent manner, in such a way as to provoke extreme violence, which would completely disrupt government and society.

The writings of Ralph Bunche, founder of the National Negro Congress, a Communist front, in *Science and Society*, a Communist magazine, of which he was a contributing editor, laid out the complete blueprint for what is happening in America today. He contributed to this publication and added his name and prestige as a professor of Howard University even after the Communists in their publication, *The Communist*, openly stated that *Science and Society* magazine had as its function "to help Marxism-Leninism" and "to bring Communist thought into academic circles." Any American who does not recognize the fine hand of Communism in this unhappy picture is simply blind.

In these 35 years there has been a building up of the tools of dictatorship, augmented by decisions of the Supreme Court, and by a series of Executive Orders, which give the President the unconstitutional right to take control of communications, transportation, public utilities, the labor force, in fact, every facet of industry and local government, so that a dictatorship can be created instantaneously, and there is very little that can be done about it. In fact, after what you are going to go through, in the way of a long, hot summer of discontent, riots, murder, looting, and the destruction of property, you may well be conditioned to ask for dictatorship as a relief from anarchy.

This is the choice that you, my fellow Americans, face in this year of our Lord, 1968.

WALLACE: BACKGROUND & VIEWS

Today, the United States is a nation apparently on the verge of disaster. Wallace... From farm boy to President?

Background

FROM FARM BOY TO GOVERNOR'S CHAIR

George Corley Wallace was born at Clio, Ala., August 25, 1919, the son of a dirt farmer. . . As a youth, he did chores on the farm and later served as a Page in the State Senate. . . He quarterbacked the high school football team and twice won the Southern Golden Gloves bantamweight boxing championship.

After graduating from Barbour County High School, he worked his way through the University of Alabama by waiting on tables and helping out in the kitchen. . . He was president of the Freshman Class, captain of the baseball and boxing teams, finalist in the Student Debating Tournament, president of the Spirit Committee, a member of Phi Alpha Delta Legal Fraternity and a member of the Law School Honor Court.

He received his law degree in 1942 and immediately volunteered for the U. S. Air Corps, seeing heavy combat duty as a B-29 Flight Sergeant in World War II. During military service, he married Lurleen Burns who, until her sad and re-

cent decease, was also Governor of Alabama.

Following the war, George Wallace became an assistant attorney general in Alabama and at the age of 27 was elected to the Alabama House of Representatives, where he served with distinction. During this time, he had his own law office in Clayton, Ala.

In 1948, Wallace was elected a delegate to the National Democratic Con-

vention, and in 1956 he served on the Convention Platform Committee. In 1953, he was elected Judge of the Third Judicial Circuit in Alabama, becoming the youngest Circuit Judge in the nation. In 1958 he ran for Governor and four years later was elected to the State's highest office by a record vote.

During his administration (1963-1967), Alabama enjoyed record-breaking growth in industry, education, high-

way construction and other phases of state government. There was not a single hint of scandal during his four years in office.

He is a Lay Leader and member of the Board of Stewards of the Clayton, Ala., Methodist Church, where he has been a Sunday School teacher for over 20 years. He served as a delegate to the Central Conference of Methodist Churches.

He is a member of the American Legion, Amvets, VFW, Woodman, Moose, Elks, Civitans, Alabama Council of Better Schools, Alabama PTA, Board of Directors Alabama Pensions Institute, Inc., and Alabama Tuberculosis Association.

EXPRESSED IN WALLACE'S OWN PUBLIC STATEMENTS

On his Presidential candidacy:

... I have said many times if one of the two national parties does not give the American people a choice in 1968, that I will be a candidate, and the way it seems at the moment, the candidate and the attitude of the leadership of both national parties is that there will not be a choice.

On State Rights:

... I recommend that the states of the Union continue to determine the policies of their domestic institutions themselves and that the bureaucrats and

theoreticians in Washington let the people in Ohio and New York and California decide themselves. . . what type of school system they are going to have. I recommend states rights and local government, and territorial democracy. . . .

On Crime:

The first thing I would do as President is to make an announcement that I'd give my moral support as President to the policemen of this country and to the firemen of the country. I'd say, "We stand behind you because you are the thin line between complete anarchy in the streets and the physical safety of our person."

On Vietnam:

... I think the first thing we ought to do in this country is to impress upon Hanoi and Peking and Moscow the resolve of the American people. These few people today who are out advocating sedition and raising money and clothes and supplies for the Viet Cong—these college professors who are making speeches advocating victory for the Viet Cong Communists—I would deal with these people as they ought to be dealt with: as traitors.

On his Support:

You stand with me, and we, together, can give courageous leadership to millions of people throughout this great nation. . . in the fight to win and preserve our freedom and liberties. . . If the politicians get in the way in 1968, a lot of

them are going to get run over by this average man on the street, this man in the textile mill, this man in the steel mill, this barber, the beautician, the policeman on the beat. They are the ones—and the little businessman—I think those are the mass of people that are going to support a change on the domestic scene in this country.

Lawlessness Ranks No. 1

The number one concern of Americans is the rising tide of lawlessness in this country, according to a Newsletter survey of Republican Congressmen who have returned to the Capital after visiting their districts over the Easter recess.

The war in Vietnam and the prospect of a tax hike are a close second and third, the poll showed.

Rep. Melvin R. Laird of Wisconsin, chairman of the House Republican Conference, put it this way:

"The number one concern continues to be peace—peace in our city streets and peace in Vietnam. Everywhere I went, people asked, 'What's happening in this country? Where's our leadership? What's happening to law and order?'"

Rep. Paul Findley, who visited his Illinois constituency over the 10-day Congressional vacation, commented:

"Individuals in my part of the country are very upset by the recent riots. They are afraid that such things just might stampede Congress into action that they otherwise might not take."

"Crime, riots, demonstrations—all three are very much on the minds of my constituents," said Rep. William J. Scherle of Iowa. "They resent the Justice Department not using its means to control much of this lawlessness. They want to know why Stokely Carmichael and people like him aren't behind bars."

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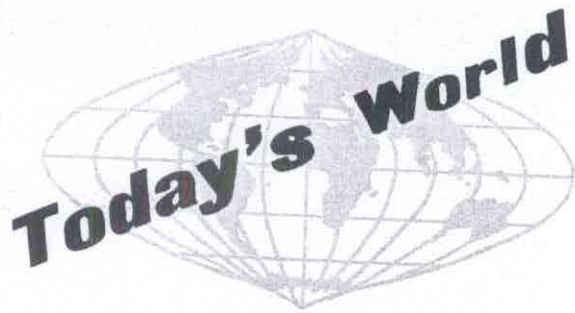
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DIVIDE AND CONQUER

Let's face it, busy women raising a family don't have a great deal of time for reading, attending lectures or researching in Libraries. Yet, because they are somehow able to arrive at a logical conclusion without any apparent exercise in reason, the male will invariably raise a quizzical eyebrow and label the process "intuition." Call it what you will, many women who know little or nothing of Rhodesia—who haven't got around to reading Douglas Reed's "Battle For Rhodesia"—offer passionate support to the Ian Smith government for the simple reason that they have been inundated with anti-Rhodesia propaganda from sources which are questionable to say the least, and which, when found on sale in Canada's numerous Communist bookstores, indicate what side finds them worth promoting.

THE TECHNIQUE IN CANADA & U.S.A.

We don't have to go much further than the "Canadian Tribune" (official publication of the Canadian Communist Party) to discover how Rhodesia has become part of the "divide and conquer" technique of the international conspiracy and how Communists, socialists, fellow travelers and dupes have obediently jumped to their Moscow command to create hatred between black man and white. The technique is as familiar as bread and jam. In Canada, we have seen it at work in French-speaking Quebec—creating a division between French-speaking and English-speaking Canadians. In The U.S.A. the technique has been used to create hatred between Negro and white, with Negro revolutionaries now openly proclaiming their allegiance to Cuba, Moscow and Peiping. Along with French Canadian and Black Power, we hear also of Red Power, a new move to agitate North-American Indians and organize them into yet another revolutionary front. While Cuba beams short wave radio broadcast to Quebec in French, giving instructions on guerrilla training, so of late broadcasts from Radio Havana have been picked up in English, and designed to organize a Red Power movement in Canada and the U.S.A.

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The divide and conquer technique, first found in the writing of Karl Marx as the "class struggle" of setting worker against employer, has been adapted to all kinds of situations in just about every country in the world. In fifty years of Communist conquest and expansionism, the technique has managed to enslave two-thirds of the world; to absorb over 37 sovereign states; to destroy the British Empire and create revolution wherever the seeds of hatred could be planted.

THE HIPPIE MOVEMENT

Even the world-wide Hippie movement, believed by many to be a purely spontaneous phenomenon, is distinguished by the similarity of its political ideology in every country where it is found. Look at any tatty Hippie newspaper and one finds the usual anti-American, anti-Rhodesian, get-out-of-Vietnam, admit Red China to the U.N. propaganda. At a recent Canadian Hippie meeting, leaflets were distributed calling attention to an upcoming Black Power-Red Power meeting. Hippies in Germany profess disillusionment with the traditional left-wing party and promote philosophies just a hair's breadth away from outright Communism. Claiming Marxism as the key to their political ambitions, their so-called "love-ins" are distinguished by their hatred of America, cops, the establishment and the free enterprise system.

"SOCIAL SERVICE" CLERGYMEN

It doesn't take a great intellect or a scholar to discover just who wants Independent Rhodesia destroyed and why. A batch of literature which reached my desk from Toronto recently, contained leaflets from the October 21 Mobilization to End the War in Vietnam Committee, along with a vitriolic leaflet attacking the Ian Smith government. In both instances, one of the key promoters was one Rev. Ray Hord,

Secretary of the United Church Board of Social Service. Along with trying to raise funds to aid U.S. draft dodgers (currently hiding out in Canada) the Rev. Hord has achieved much publicity as main speaker at sundry anti-American, get-out-of-Vietnam protest marches, and fund raising drives where 90 per cent of funds go to the Communists. At a recent "Hiroshima Day" rally at the Canadian-U.S. border, well-known Communists, socialists and Hippies dominated the gathering and literature on sale included Mao's Thoughts, magazines printed in Peiping and an assortment of left-wing buttons together with slogans too filthy to be put into print.

The Rev. Hord and his Church and International Affairs Committee of the United Church have not overlooked Rhodesia and an expensive three color pamphlet informs us that Rhodesia is a "Canadian Christian concern." That concern, we are told, must become manifest as demanding that the Canadian government reaffirm her stand that there be no independence in Rhodesia before majority rule; that we demand stronger sanctions and that we send in Canadian troops to unseat the Rhodesian government! Wild? You haven't heard the half of it! Notwithstanding the usual Red line of "police brutality" we are told that you are literally branding your Black citizens like animals; that you impose jail sentences on thousands of Africans without trial and God knows what else. Now really, do you also eat little black babies for breakfast with your Wheaties? Yes, my dear friends, we Christians in Canada are actually being urged to take up arms against you—our brothers and sisters in Christ—by men who masquerade as ministers and who use our pulpits to foster hatred and violence—who practice the divide and conquer technique setting Black man against white; French Canadian against English Canadian, native Indian against white, worker against capitalist, and Hippie against the Establishment, family and the Law.

It's a sad commentary on our Christian community when these so-called ministers of God are permitted to use their positions

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THE GREAT ATLANTIC CHARTER MYSTERY

In August, 1941, Roosevelt and Churchill met off Newfoundland in Placentia Bay, and produced the "Atlantic Charter, which was supposed to guarantee all kinds of freedoms to mankind, and restore the territorial integrity and freedom of all the occupied nations.

A beautifully framed and illuminated Atlantic Charter was hung in the National Museum in Washington, and thousands of visitors viewed it. The Office of War Information (OWI) printed 240,000 copies of it.

On January 1, 1942, 26 nations came together and signed a declaration in Washington supporting the principles of the Atlantic Charter, and formed the "United Nations."

When the details of the Teheran Conference leaked out, and it became known that the occupied nations, who had been guaranteed the right of self-government after victory, had been betrayed, Roosevelt was asked about the Atlantic Charter he and Churchill had signed, by reporters at a press conference on December 20, 1944. His reply literally bowled over the correspondents. There was not, and never had been an Atlantic Charter signed by him and Churchill, he replied. Then where is the Charter now, he was asked. He replied, "There wasn't any copy of the Atlantic Charter so far as I know." It was just a press release. It was scribbled on a piece of paper by him and Churchill, Summer Welles and

to promote agitation; to urge that their parishioners pressure the Government to enact left-wing policies; to interfere in other countries' internal problems; who use church donations to aid U.S. draft dodgers or aid Vietnam children (said funds going in cash by way of Moscow and Peiping!). It's too bad that we are forced to criticize the Church (or at least those who have gained control of it) although in the final analysis, we the laity are the Church. Ministers, while individual members of the Mystical Body, are but custodians of the bricks and mortar, keepers of the books. Ideally, they are also shepherds of the flock. Sir Alexander Cadogan, and handed to the radio operators on the ships to put on the air as a news release.

John O'Donnell, of the New York Daily News, asked the curator of the museum where he had obtained the Charter. He was told that it came from the OWI, who had "loaned" the precious document to the National Museum. O'Donnell enquired at the OWI, and found that they had gotten it up, and affixed the names of Roosevelt and Churchill. By the time O'Donnell got back to the museum with his information, the great Charter had disappeared! An attendant told him it had been ordered off the wall just 20 minutes before!

We have attempted to locate an original copy of the Atlantic Charter, and so far our efforts have been rewarded with a signal lack of success. After receiving one or two arrogant and insulting letters from the Library of Congress, they finally admitted that there was no such document, and confirmed the story above of Roosevelt's press conference. It appears that there is a hand-written or typed copy at the Roosevelt Memorial Library in Hyde Park, N.Y., of the press release, signed only by Roosevelt, with Churchill's name in FDR's hand-

writing. Churchill's war memoirs, Vol. III, "The Grand Alliance," shows a photostat copy of a typed draft, with English-style spelling, with inked-in corrections, again unsigned. The State Paper Room of the British Museum in London also appears to be unable to produce an original copy of the Charter. However, they provided photostat copies of a 12-page pamphlet printed by Whitcombe and Tomber, Ltd., giving the text of the Charter, and a preface and postscript. Signatures purporting to be those of Roosevelt and Churchill appear in the pamphlet, but they are obviously not taken from the original Charter. The seal of the British Museum appears on the pamphlet. The preface of this pamphlet says, "On January 1, 1942, the United Nations came into being."

The Atlantic Charter meeting was obviously just a cover-up story to hide the real reason for their meeting, which was to plan how to bring America into World War II. The \$64,000 question we would like the answer to is, "If the U.N. came into being on January 1, 1942, based on the principles of a so-called Atlantic Charter which never existed, how in tarnation can the U.N. legally exist?"

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SPOTLIGHT ON THE MIDDLE EAST

LIBYA IN ARMS RACE

LONDON—An order for an air defense system for Libya understood to be worth 100 million sterling was announced by the British Aircraft Corporation (BAC) Monday night.

BAC said the order is for Thunderbird high altitude anti-aircraft missiles, Rapier low-level missiles, radar, computers and communications systems.

It was Britain's biggest ever order for an air defense system, the corporation said.

BAC said it would also provide full technical support, including spares, training and maintenance.

Announcing the order at a London press conference, only two hours after returning from Libya, G.R. Jefferson, chairman and managing director of BAC's guided weapons division, said the order would provide work for many parts of export-conscious Britain.

Britain and Libya have had friendly ties since World War II. As a pre-war Italian colony, Libya was taken over by the British after the battle of Alamein. It was Britain who ushered Libya to independence in 1951.

The Thunderbird missile is in service with the British Army and in Saudi Arabia. The Rapier is a highly mobile anti-aircraft system for low-level defense against air attack.

Jefferson said he was confident the

Libyan order would lead to many more in other countries.

The whole order was imperilled recently by a strike of British airline stewardesses complaining about the prices in their canteen. An official carrying vital papers between London and Libya was held up by the strike.

"Fortunately, the delay was only a few hours," said a BAC spokesman, "But if we hadn't got the papers we wouldn't have got the order."

At the same time, BAC announced Monday that the Sultan of Muscat and Oman is building a jet air force to protect his new oil revenues against spreading revolution from the turbulent people's republic of South Yemen.

Israel To Trade With Singapore

A four-man Israeli economic mission flew into Singapore to negotiate a trade agreement with Singapore. The mission is a follow-up to talks which the Israeli Finance Minister, P. Sapir, had in Singapore two months ago. The leader of the mission is Zvezer Chelouche, assistant director of the Israeli Foreign Affairs Ministry. Asked whether his talks with the Singapore government would include the establishment of diplomatic ties, Chelouche said: "Our talks will embrace all matters of common interest to our two governments." The talks will begin shortly.

Red Syrian Government Confiscates Fifty-Four Private Schools

DAMASCUS—The openly pro-Communist Syrian Government has taken legal measures transferring the ownership of 54 private schools to the State, a statement by the education ministry said here.

The 54 schools, owned mostly by Western religious orders, were seized without compensation last October for defying a decree placing government-

appointed directors at the head of every private school in Syria.

The schools have, in effect, been owned and operated by the State since then, and the ministerial order issued a few days ago by Education Minister So-leiman Khish was only a legal step finalizing the operation, the statement said.

Meanwhile, a new organization, the Youth Union of the Revolution, came into being in Syria Saturday night.

The chairman of the Preparatory Committee of the new organization, Nabih Khatib, said in a ceremony attended by leaders of the ruling Arab Baath Socialist Party and representatives of People's Organizations that the new union "will express the aspirations of the new generation within a nationalist, Socialist and humane framework."

The union, he said, "will hold contacts with youth movements in other Arab countries with the intention of achieving a fusion in the struggle to put an end to division and backwardness."

The union would also hold military training courses for young people, he added.

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Hungary Ready To Help Egypt

Cairo-Communist, Hungarian puppet, "President" Paul Losonczi says his country is ready to cooperate with Egypt in all fields to "eliminate traces of Israeli aggression" in a message to President Nasser.

The message was in reply to one sent by President Nasser thanking Hungary for its attitude in the United Nations Security Council during the recent debate on Israel's military parade in Jerusalem.

Zayyen Against "Imperialism" And "Zionism"

DAMASCUS—Syria's Premier, Dr. Youssef Zayyen, has expressed his country's readiness to go ahead with any step toward union between "the liberal Arab countries." Speaking in Bou Kamal near the Iraqi frontier, Dr. Zayyen said that "the revolution in Syria will continue to struggle toward achieving that union and upset the strategy of imperialism and Zionism in the area."

WANT TO GET 99 PER CENT VOTE?

Imitate Dictator Nasser

There is one way to "enjoy" the full "support" of your people if you happen to be an overly ambitious politician: use tried and true Communist-planned electoral tactics. Red dictators never get less than 99% of the vote, no matter how many persons may be opposed to them. There are "ways" and "means" to bring about the desired results and although they are, to put it very mildly, extremely rough, the Marxist politicians need not worry over "adverse world opinion" or anything else. That is left to the poor, benighted, non-Marxists and "right-wingers" who worry themselves sick over what others may think of their electoral techniques. A good example of the joys of absolute power is offered in a report sent out by the British Reuters agency, printed in the front page of the May 4 edition of Lebanon's widely read *Daily Star*. It was headlined: 99.989 PERCENT OF EGYPTIANS SAY "YES" TO NASSER'S PLANS. Notice that not even for decency's sake, does the report

refer to Nasser as a dictator or shed a bit of light on the ridiculous electoral sham it is publicizing. One can well imagine how different the matter would have been handled if the phony plebiscite had been carried out by a non-Marxist or non-"liberal" ruler! Wrote Reuters in the *Daily Star*:

"CAIRO—President Nasser won a solid vote of confidence from Egyptians Friday for his plans to revitalize the nation.

"Results of a plebiscite—99.989 per cent vote in favor of his reform program—also reflected an obvious desire among Egyptians not to split ranks in the face of what President Nasser has called an "inevitable" battle against Israel.

"Although a mammoth 'Yes' had been assured from the plebiscite, the first in six years, some political experts here had predicted a rather high fi-of dissenters following recent signs of social and political discontent.

"But President Nasser was quick to make concessions to February rioters, reshuffled his cabinet, acknowledged that mistakes and abuses had been made and, in the past two months, appears clearly to have reassessed his leadership of the Egyptian people.

"Announcing the results of the plebiscite, Interior Minister Sharawi Gomaa said that 7,317,419 electors cast their votes in the nationwide test of President Nasser's leadership and his proposed remedies for Egypt's ills.

" 'Yes' votes numbered 7,315,734, 'No' 798. There were 887 void votes.

"The result massively endorses President Nasser's declared order of priorities, headed by the removal of the Israeli occupation of Sinai since the June war.

"The plebiscite, first since Egyptians backed the national charter six years ago, followed cabinet changes and removal of sectional 'power groups' which President Nasser said were hindering the progress of the 1952 revolution."

How de Gaulle Outwits U.S.A.—U.S.S.R. In Africa

JOHANNESBURG—France is successfully playing both ends against the middle in Africa while the United States, Britain and Russia watch enviously from the diplomatic sidelines.

President Charles de Gaulle's government pursues self-interest in Africa with impunity from criticism. "De Gaulle must do it with mirrors," said one American diplomat in South Africa.

If the United States so much as abstains on a technical vote involving South Africa in the United Nations, it is criticized in black African capitals. France sells "Mirage" jets, AMX tanks, "Panhard" armored cars, "Alouette" helicopters and "Daphne" submarines to South Africa in open defiance of U.N. INSIGHT On The News, June 1, 1968

sanctions.

Britain is scorned in Zambia and Tanzania for not using force to topple the breakaway white regime in Rhodesia. France interests do business as usual in Salisbury, the Rhodesian capital.

French aid to Africa is provided only under the strictest terms, even when granted with no strings attached.

Russia, Britain and the United States have had to defend their position on the civil war in Nigeria. One French bank was reported to have lent \$6 million to secessionist Biafra for arms.

Black African militants sneer at Washington for supplying weapons to Portugal under the NATO agreement—weapons which may be used against "free-

dom fighters" in Angola and Mozambique. There are signs that France will become the main supplier of jet aircraft and bombs to Portugal's armies in Africa.

African states in the U.N. bitterly criticized the United States for providing transport planes to help an insurrection in the Congo in 1964. French paratroopers flew into Libreville that same (Continues on last page)

Floridians were shocked! Suddenly, almost out of nowhere, two of the State's major educational centers, Florida State University at Tallahassee and the plush, country clubish University of Miami, were faced with ugly and extremely disagreeable student "incidents." At Tallahassee, the young president of FSU presented his resignation under pressure from a minority of students equating "freedom of expression" in a college periodical with freedom to print crude, filthy and unimaginative "four-letter words."

In Miami, a handful of individuals banded together into what they called the United Black Students, used "non-violent" sit-ins to stampede UM President Henry King Stanford into acceding to demands for black student scholarships and the hiring of Negro "sociologists." The fact that in both cases, Tallahassee and Miami, the rebellious students had contemptuously ignored and flouted the law, was justified and rationalized, not only by many faculty members, but also by certain influential "Liberal" news organs and opinion moulders. It may have been an unwitting revelation, but the one to let the cat out of the bag on what was going on behind the scenes at UM was Harold T. Fields who, according to an interview with *The Miami Herald's* Al Burt, was one of the leaders and organizers of the United Black Students (UBS) at the University of Miami.

The *Herald's* piece quoted Fields as saying, among other things: "I believe basically the political structure in this country is corrupt." And, "If a revolution comes (in the U.S.), I don't expect the black man to win. But the white man will finally realize something is wrong. A revolution is a cleansing agent."

counts, Tedeschi leaves no doubt in any intelligent mind as to his ideology and sinister convictions.

'They hardly ever take my advice,' he said."

What Burt did not say, what Tedeschi does not say, and what UM President Henry King Stanford very conveniently refrains from saying is that the leaders of the SDS have openly and repeatedly confessed their ideological ties with Fidel Castro, the Communist Party, USA, and the international Communist machinery.

Only several months ago, SDS's top brass traveled to Havana to be wined, dined and instructed by Fidel Castro himself. Is it any wonder that Tedeschi's friend, UBS leader Harold T. Fields, admires Castro?

lowing manner: "SDS has carried its program of the united front to such an extent that it now feels it must involve itself directly with the young Communists in a variety of activities. . . SDS shelved the Communist exclusion clause in its constitution and threw open its membership to young Communists. This new policy has now allowed, for example, Carl Bloice, a staff member of the west coast newspaper, *People's Voice*, and editor of the DuBois magazine, *Insurgent* (also ace writer for *The Worker*) to be a member of both SDS and DuBois." The FBI has identified the DuBois Clubs as leading front organization for the Communist Party, USA!

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In testimony given before the House Appropriations Subcommittee on February 23, released for national publication on May 18, 1968, J. Edgar Hoover, FBI Director, said the New Left, typified by the Students for a Democratic Society active in campus disturbances, is "a new type of subversive, and their danger is great." Hoover expressed concern over reports that black nationalist groups are stockpiling weapons "for use against the white man. . . ?"

The University of Miami's UBS's leaders have frankly admitted their "black-nationalist" and pro-revolutionary structure and inclinations.

J. Edgar Hoover also said that reports on stockpiling of weapons by the black subversives could well be true because guns are easily obtained, and "in light of the inflammatory urgings of such agitators as Stokely Carmichael, H. Rap Brown and James Forman of the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee." In all fairness to these black conspirators, it should be emphasized that pro-Red whites active on the University of Miami campus are as "subversive" and rabidly anti-U.S. in their expressions as their black counterparts and pawns. UM's own professors of the Tedeschi and Ross Beiler brand leave no stone unturned in verbally promoting Marxist-Leninist causes and issues.

That Communists and fellow travelers should do their utmost to tear down the fabric of a free American society in order to "change it" into a totalitarian Marxist regime is neither new nor surprising. Assiduously, they have been performing their traitorous tasks for well over half a century. What does appear incredible is the absolute refusal on the part of civic and business leaders in Florida and elsewhere to finally take the Red bulls by their horns, publicly unmask them and apply to them the full weight of public and legal condemnation. 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McCARTHY AND HIS FLORIDA CREW

While Bobby Kennedy may be the nitty-gritty of the Liberal Democratic pack, those who know a real Liberal from an opportunist have their eye on Gene—"Clean Gene"—McCarthy.

Those eyes were focused collectively on the handsome and articulate Minnesotan during his recent visit to Miami, home base for four of the 25 headquarters throughout Florida.

If there were any doubts that he was the annointed one, they were quickly dispelled by the hard-core coterie of miscellaneous local Leftists assembled at the airport, at Hibiscus Auditorium in Miami Beach and before a reported crowd of 5,000 students at the University of Miami.

Decrying U.S. "militarism" generally, McCarthy, taking careful measure of his heavily Jewish audiences, apparently felt America not militaristic enough in aiding Israel during the most recent Middle East crisis. To a lover, such torturous ideological twists can be overlooked. This reciprocal love was reflected in the eyes of his dedicated workers in the campaign headquarters at 2800 Coral Way when INSIGHT On The News paid a recent visit.

Mrs. Cindy Thorne, a Democratic committeewoman and member of the radical Leftist American Civil Liberties Union, and Mrs. Allan Milledge, wife of the State chairman for McCarthy, were extremely cordial and gracious.

The Milledge family, the late Circuit Court judge, Stanley, and his wife, have been the local lights of the ACLU for many years.

While the ACLU, and Left-oriented groups generally have made cause celebre of the separation of church and state, no such outcry is heard from their own ranks.

Rev. Fred LeShame, pastor of the First Unitarian Church, one of the main centers of ultra-Left activity in Miami, is on the McCarthy speakers bureau list, as is Rabbi Joseph R. Narot, whose congregational work is ecumenically divided between his own Temple Israel and the Quaker-affiliated American Friends Ser-

vice "Peace Center," another hotbed of revolutionary activity.

Rabbi Narot was also on the May 28 McCarthy delegate slate.

Another minister whose work has centered on the political as well as the religious needs of the migrant workers is the Rev. David Havens, also a participant in the Vietnam Summer and the Peace Center.

University of Miami administration, faculty and students are also providing fodder for Clean Gene's campaign to finish once and for always the last remaining stumbling block to world "Socialism."

Among the more notable are Dr. H. Franklin Williams, the longtime cohesive force who has bound the ultra-Left in Miami for nearly two decades, and Mrs.

Williams, also a Democratic delegate.

Dr. James Tedeschi, a psychology professor with a penchant to mold his students' minds with a Leftist twist, is another articulate voice for McCarthy.

Other speakers in behalf of the Minnesotan's candidacy are Herbert Heiken, a former ACLU chairman, who created a controversy in South Miami when he attempted to rent a home for former heavyweight champion, Sonny Liston, while he was training for a fight here.

Rhodesian Roundup

The Hangings. The recent international clamor over the execution of condemned murderers in Rhodesia, ultimately involving Queen Elizabeth II and the Pope, seems extraordinary in light of the salient facts:

- 1) Executions of prisoners sentenced to death were postponed in Rhodesia pending judicial determination of the legal status following the declaration of independence on November 11, 1965.
 - 2) The Appellate Division of the High Court of Rhodesia in a Constitutional test case last January ruled that the Smith Administration was the *de facto* government of Rhodesia and that under the 1961 Constitution, internal sovereignty was granted to Rhodesia.
 - 3) Rhodesia has a death penalty, while Britain has abolished it; Britain has no judicial authority in Rhodesia. Rhodesia therefore holds that the British government acted unconstitutionally in directing Queen Elizabeth to act on an appeal by three defendants to commute their sentences.
 - 4) The three defendants whose last-minute appeals were rejected by the Rhodesian High Court, which also held "Her Majesty powerless in the matter," were duly executed on March 6. They had been convicted of spectacularly brutal murders, and no mitigating circumstances were found.
 - 5) An additional six defendants were scheduled to die on March 11. The Pope appealed for clemency and deplored the previous execution of the three Africans, though it is not clear whether he was aware that they were convicted murderers. In any event, two of this second group of condemned men had murdered a tribal chief in 1964 and were executed; the other four, guilty of terrorist acts, were reprieved by the Rhodesian government.
 - 6) The Government announced on March 13 the following disposition of backed-up death-sentence cases. Of 85, whose judicial appeals had been exhausted, 5 had been hanged, 47 were reprieved

(including the four on March 11), and 33 cases, including the most serious ones, require further consideration; an additional 20 have not yet exhausted their appeals. The Rhodesian Cabinet is reported to be divided on carrying out the death penalties under the Law and Order Act, the anti-terrorist statute, where no loss of life was involved.

It should occasion no surprise that the Organization of African Unity has called upon Britain to arrest Ian Smith and try him for the "murder" of the hanged murderers, nor the Kenyan student demonstrators in Nairobi pelted the British Deputy High Commissioner with rotten tomatoes, chanted taunts of



"toothless bulldog," and demanded in their placards "Hang Smith and Wilson, the murderers." It is surprising that, through the device of calling terrorists "freedom fighters," it is seriously contended that they should not be held responsible for their crimes *by the government under attack*. Revolutionaries may be heroes in their own eyes and even in the eyes of others, but it is novel doctrine that they either give or seek quarter from their target government.

The Guerrilla Campaign. The first sizable wave of guerrilla attacks since last August was launched from Zambia and put down by Rhodesian security forces during the last two weeks of March. The two banned nationalist parties of Rhodesia—ZANU (Zimbabwe African Na-

tional Union) and ZAPU (Zimbabwe African Peoples Union), both very small—maintain headquarters in the Zambian capital of Lusaka, but a special news team of the (London) *Times* found that they "show more enthusiasm for fighting among themselves than for battling with the whites in Rhodesia." The Communist-trained and Zambia-based force of some 1000 to 2000 African nationalists has met with little success in the OAU campaign against Rhodesia. The same *Times* team reports from Rhodesia that "there has been no disturbance to the pattern of life in such small centers as Victoria Falls, Wankie, Kariba, Karoi, and Sinoia, which lie in the path of any progress the men (i.e., the guerrillas) might make from the Zambezi southwards (and) there is no evidence to support claims from Zambia that Rhodesian Africans are joining forces with the infiltrators."

Negotiations? Sir Alec Douglas-Hume, who met with Ian Smith in the presence of Sir Humphrey Gibbs and Sir Hugh Beadle, the Chief Justice of Rhodesia, on a visit to Salisbury in February, returned to Britain with proposals that promised a probable resumption of negotiations. The uproar over the hangings, however, provided Prime Minister Wilson with yet another occasion to make the worst of all possible choices; he declined to conduct talks "in the shadow of the gallows."

Proposals to "intensify" the ineffective sanctions by introducing a postal, telecommunications, and travel ban were promptly brought forward in the Commonwealth Sanctions Committee, and debate got under way in the U.N. Security Council on March 19 on a total trade ban for dealing with Rhodesia. Rhodesia's petition to the U.N. to be heard was again ignored; Zambia again called for force, being somewhat understandably fed up with sanctions; Britain again ruled out force; the Defense Cor-

• From *The Times* (London), March 23: "Mr. Muhammad Haji Ibrahim Egal, the Prime Minister of Somalia, who arrived in London yesterday on a four-day official visit, began his stay with a declaration the African countries should adopt a new approach to Rhodesia. They should, he said, be 'wooing' her just as much as South Africa was. Mr. Egal suggested that Mr. Smith's regime should be given the opportunity to join the Organization for African Unity, and Rhodesian whites given the chance to become Africans."

• From *The Times* (London), April 4: "Mr. John Salakov, secretary of the Middle East-Africa League, intends to visit 10 member states of the Organization of African Unity (O.A.U.). Mr. Salakov, a Nigerian, is trying to persuade the O.A.U. countries that they should renounce the use of force and give diplomatic recognition to Rhodesia. He hopes that in this way Mr. Ian Smith's regime might undergo a change of heart and begin to promote Africans into positions of responsibility."

• From the *New York Times*, March 22: "... on March 8, Salisbury's only daily paper, *The Rhodesia Herald*, displayed a photograph of an Italian ore freighter carrying 18,000 tons of Rhodesian chrome from Lourenco Marques in Mozambique to Odessa. [To be re-sold to the U.S. at the increased Soviet price?] 'Despite United Nations sanctions,' the caption said, 'there is still a fairly regular flow of Rhodesian ore to foreign buyers.'"

• From *The Times* (London), February 5: "At home, he [President Kaunda of Zambia] threatened 'to fight with all the force at my command and reduce to nothingness' leaders who promoted tribalism. He said the Army and police must not listen to the complaints of politicians who approached them 'along tribal lines.' 'They want another Nigeria,' he claimed, adding that *coup* after *coup* came because men lost their reason. He appealed to the Army and police to voice complaints through the proper channels. In the presence of the party leaders [of his ruling United National Independence Party], he ordered the Commissioner of Police and the Attorney General to dismiss any government employee who had approached the opposition United Party. In future, he said, M.P.'s would not be allowed to visit the Zambian provinces without his written permission."

• C. L. Sulzberger in the *New York Times*, February 25: "Admiral Edouard Riviere commands a French 'intervention' force with advance headquarters in Senegal. . . . These units can be used in any of the several Francophone African states with which Paris has negotiated accords permitting such action. . . . The logic of this system allows Paris to run from behind the scenes a huge African domain. Generous financing and discreet diplomacy combine to make France number one Western power in black Africa's popularity, although it has unabashedly sold arms to South Africa while Britain and the U.S.A. refuse."

KENYA'S AFRICANIZATION

The impact of the "Africanization" programs of the three East African countries of Tanzania, Uganda, and Kenya was dramatically demonstrated when Kenya suddenly stepped up the pace in January. The passage of laws requiring work permits for non-citizens and reserving retail and wholesale trading in rural areas to citizens precipitated a large exodus among the 190,000 Asians living in Kenya, three-quarters of whom opted for British rather than Kenyan citizenship after Kenya became independent in 1963.

Some of the Asians in East Africa are descended from traders who left India centuries ago, but most are descended from artisans and laborers who came at the end of the 19th century when the railway from Mombasa to the interior was being built. The present-day Kenyan Asians are largely middle class, ranging from small traders, shopkeepers, and skilled artisans to wealthy business men, lawyers, teachers, doctors, and civil servants. They are the backbone of the economy, since black Kenyans do not yet have training and skills in sufficient numbers to make a modern economy function. Economists at the University of Nairobi have warned of the consequences of abrupt action: a drop in production in manufacturing industries, curtailment of foreign investment, disruption of the mechanism of distribution — in short, impairment of economic growth.

Political pressures — not least those inspired by deep-seated African prejudice against the Asians — are evidently responsible for the unwise, uneconomic move. Kenyan stability may be further jarred if 75-year-old Jomo Kenyatta, as rumored, does retire. Tom Mboya, the able Minister for Economic Planning, is not eligible as a presidential candidate, being only 36, while the minimum age is 40. Mr. Oginga Odinga, the left-wing opposition leader who has clashed with Kenyatta, is waiting in the wings. He was, incidentally, prevented from leaving Kenya to deliver a paper to a Boston University symposium on April 5; in the address, distributed at a press conference, he charged that the greatest cause of instability in Africa today is "the subversive activities of the rich nations, including South Africa, aimed at putting into positions of leadership the type of people who will allow peaceful exploitation of Africa."

The main external repercussion of Kenya's Africanization moves was the British Parliament's panicky legislation to restrict the rights of the Kenyan Asians who are British citizens by limiting their entry to 1500 per year. The vote in the House of Commons was 372 to 62, with some 180 abstaining; the House of Lords approved the curb more narrowly, 109-85. India's Minister of State for External Affairs, B. R. Bhagat, said India was thinking of lodging a

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NOTES FROM HERE AND THERE

• President Kenneth Kaunda of ZAMBIA announced on April 19 that the state would take over 25 major companies, including subsidiaries of foreign-owned groups, in transportation, brewing, building, wholesale and retail trade, timber and fish. The rich copper-mining groups will not change hands, but they will have a new royalty plan and will be restricted to sending no more than 50% of their profits abroad, the remainder to be used for development in Zambia.

• The new Ambassador to the United States from GHANA, Mr. E. M. Debrab, reports that Ghana's economy has now been stabilized and that foreign investment is welcome as a way for the country to help itself. Incentives for foreign investment include 10-year exemption from taxes, no restriction on transfer of profits, and guaranties of protection against expropriation.

• Sekou Touré of GUINEA announced what he calls "the second stage of the revolution," in which external relations will be softened but internally his rigid Marxist regime will devote itself to attacking the remaining vestiges of capitalism, tribalism, and religion. The *ECONOMIST* reports "the capital; Conakry, is without flour and sugar and is often short of rice, the staple food. . . . With thousands in prison without trial, over half a million Guineans — including one young adult male in three — have fled to neighboring states or to Europe." With its rich bauxite and iron mines and its pineapples and other fruit for export, its economy is basically healthy. As an ambassador in Dakar put it: "It required some sort of genius to make a country like that go bankrupt."

• The off-shore oil strike in ANGOLA is being exploited by Cabinda Gulf Oil Company, a subsidiary of American Gulf, which will have invested some \$124 million by the end of 1968 when production begins. Two huge deposits of high-grade, easily worked iron ore required for their development 65 miles of railway and the construction at Mocamedes of a deep water port capable of handling the largest of the world's ore carriers; this \$100 million investment was provided by an international consortium headed by Krupp of West Germany. In addition Angola has large coffee exports and diamond mines. A new prosperity is due for the 5 million blacks and 300,000 whites of Angola, who have weathered seven years of infiltration and attack by outside "freedom fighters," with no sign of sympathetic internal revolt. The Portuguese have armed their coffee farmers, black and white, for self defense.

• Well-informed sources report that SOMALIA was under severe Soviet pressure last October to conclude the Somalia-Kenya war over the Northern Frontier District, held by Kenya and inhabited by Somalis. The Indian Ocean strategy of the Soviet Union, it is said, would be hindered if Kenya's Mombasa harbor offered facilities to the West; consequently it became important to end the friction with Kenya over Soviet backing of Somalia. Dissatisfaction over the settlement and resentment against the Russians have been manifested within Somalia.

• In a three months' investigation of the broad guerrilla movement being launched from the Congos, Tanzania and Zambia against southern Africa, a news team of the (London) *TIMES* came up with some incidental items of interest:

1.) Stokely Carmichael, "trying to put into practice Malcolm X's belief that the black struggle is international" was "far from a roaring success" on his African tour; "he was regarded as rather a brash upstart trying to teach old revolutionaries how to make bombs." He "set up contact men in Europe and Africa," but the African guerrillas told the news team that the representative he installed in Tanzania, the American Negro Munro Sharpe, "makes slight impact on the freedom movement he is supposed to be succouring."

2.) "A group of Chinese agricultural experts from the Ruwu state farm near Dar es Salaam [Tanzania] went off one weekend for a Chinese picnic. They were attacked by a swarm of non-aligned wasps, which seriously stung one of the party. Rushed to the Mubinbili hospital in Dar es Salaam, which is used by the entire diplomatic corps, the Chinese was confronted with the resident African doctor. Recoiling in horror, his friends refused to let the physician near the patient. An Asian surgeon was whistled up, but again the colour-conscious Chinese would have none of him. Twenty-six hours after the stings had been inflicted, a Chinese doctor was finally brought in from Zanzibar, 50 miles away. But too late. The patient was already dead, and the incident, though hushed up, had cooled Chinese-African relations in Dar es Salaam perceptibly."

• Alfred Friendly, Jr. in the *New York Times*, reporting from Salisbury, RHODESIA: "Two separate, silent nations are joined here in a community of fear."

Elsbeth Huxley in the *London Daily Observer*, reporting from Salisbury, Rhodesia: "On Saturdays Rhodesians of all ethnic races go to horse races, very much a family affair. . . . I saw no drunks, sjamboks or armed policemen; the sun shines, the horses shine, everyone cheers and eats and drinks, and the ethnic races mingle freely without any apparent reserve or rancour."

complaint against Britain with the United Nations Commission on Human Rights. He even suggested that Britain could be forced out of the Commonwealth for violating the *INSIGHT On The News*, June 1, 1968

respondent of the (London) *Times* reports that, in any case, military intervention against Rhodesia would be actively resisted in the services.

Meanwhile, in Rhodesia itself, Prime Minister Smith seeks to keep avenues toward a settlement open. Right-wing dissidents, led by a Mr. Len Idensoh, have split off from Mr. Smith's Rhodesian Front Party to form the Rhodesian National Party. The splinter group stands for a republic and racial segregation. Speaking in Salisbury on March 31, Mr. Smith appealed for racial tolerance and resistance to extremism. Despite temporary setbacks, he remains firm in his basic political objectives of reaching a settlement with Britain and international recognition of Rhodesia's independence.

The Rhodesian Constitutional Commission, which issued its report on April 9, dismissed the idea of Rhodesia's immediately becoming a republic, an eventuality only with a final breakdown in negotiations with Britain. The five-man commission, composed of three whites and two blacks, flatly rejected South African style apartheid and proposed a goal of racial parity as a means of achieving mutual trust—that is, the bicameral legislature to be balanced 50-50 between white and black representatives; amendments would be by two-thirds vote of both chambers, and on the "entrenched clauses," matters affecting the balance of racial representation and franchise qualifications, by an additional vote of three-fourths of both houses at a joint sitting (either the white membership, or the black, thus, could block any such amendments). This proposed goal would be reached gradually as more and more black Rhodesians meet the property and educational qualifications of the franchise.

During the next twelve months or so, a referendum on the Whaley Commission Report and an election campaign will take place. The April 6 lifting of the censorship ban on Rhodesian newspapers and magazines ensures full debate and testifies to the strength of Rhodesian independence.

So We Owe It To Ourselves

One of the favorite rationalizations of the political Liberals when you ask them how this nation can afford a constant increase in our national debt at an astronomical rate, is the classic socialist answer, "What difference does it make, we owe it to ourselves." The palpable falsehood of this answer is apparent to any half-educated and logical person. Of course we don't owe it to ourselves. The government borrows the money, and the only way it can be paid back is for the government to pay interest for the duration of the loan, and repay it eventually to the individual citizens who lent it to the government. Only in a completely Socialist State, where the government owns everything, can the government borrow from itself.

Recently, the Federal Reserve Board raised its interest rate to 5½%. This automatically increased the "prime rate" to 6½%, which is the interest rate charged to the lowest-risk borrowers. With the nation's economy spinning along at a rate that requires billions and billions of dollars of additional credit, in order to finance rapidly spiraling wage

costs, increased inventories, and higher priced raw materials, our nation is now faced with the highest interest costs in all the past 100 years since the Civil War.

In a recent statement, William M. Martin, Jr., Chairman of the Federal Reserve Board, warned that the government's failure to straighten out its finances could bring about "12%, 15% and 20% interest before we are through."

The continuation of the easy come-easy go financing of billions upon billions of dollars for government-sponsored programs, which in the first place are no business of the government and which we can no longer afford, plus the continuance of the Vietnam war, which may wear on interminably despite the so-called peace talks now proposed, have created a deficit for this fiscal year which may still total between \$22 billion and \$25 billion. So "we owe it to ourselves?" This may be a stale joke to many people, but not to those of us who pay the taxes to support the huge federal government's interest costs to carry this burden. We are now paying \$15 billion a year in interest charges, and it is the third highest expense in the federal budget. Combine this with spiraling living costs, now rapidly accelerating at the rate of over 4% a year, and a sure and certain tax increase, which will both directly and indirectly add to the burden of every person on a fixed income, particularly the retired and elderly (which the Liberals are always promising to help) and those who are working in civil service, the school teachers, the firemen, the police, and what do you see ahead? Higher taxes, higher living expenses, and more inflation. Only those who have no regard for their country's future, or who are completely naive, would recommend the fiscal policies which this nation has pursued for the past thirty-five years (since Roosevelt the second). Will we ever have a change? If we don't—there is no answer to our dilemma.

Cuba Mails Posters, Directions To Incite Negro Rebellion

The Black Power poster shown in the inset has been received in quantities by Negro militants in the United States. Mailed from Cuba, or perhaps from the Cuban Mission to the United Nations in New York City, the panther has flaming red eyes and its fangs are bared, spitting out the words, “Black Power.” The poster is aimed at inciting U.S. Negroes to riot and bears the slogan in English, French, Spanish and Arabic: “Retaliation to Crime: Revolutionary Violence.”

A mimeographed message accompanying the poster is signed by the Tri-Continental organization of subversion, formed by the Soviet Union in Havana, in January of 1966. The message states that the poster is to be used for “activities in regard to the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King,” and first showed up in Miami on April 12. Ostensibly printed in response to King’s murder, the speed with which the poster was dispatched to the United States indicates that preparations have been underway for some time.

The 1966 Tri-Continental Resolution on the American Negro began this preparation saying: “Although geographically Afro-Americans do not form a part of Latin America, Asia or Africa, the special circumstances merit special consideration and demand that the Tri-Continental Organization create the necessary mechanisms so that these brothers in the struggle will, in the future, be able to participate. . .” The next step came last August when Stokely Carmichael, Julius Lester and George Ware attended the Latin American Solidarity Conference (OLAS) in Havana. The “necessary mechanisms” had, by this time, INSIGHT On The News, June 1, 1968

indeed been created, and the OLAS Resolution agreed “on the necessity of forming a militant solidarity movement between the Afro-American peoples of the three continents. . . to answer racist violence of the imperialist U.S. government with stepped-up direct revolutionary action. . .” The Black Power poster and its accompanying instructions are but the concrete formulation of these earlier resolutions, fitting deeds to words.

What the next step will be is not yet known, but in a recent study, the Organization of American States warned: “In the United States there have been a number of acts in which the infiltration of international Communism has been clear,” and then listed them as “race

movements and the various demonstrations for peace in which signs have been carried and flyers distributed alluding to this ideology, particularly Castroism.”

Stokely Carmichael lost no time in capitalizing on King’s death, and within hours of the murder was talking on the phone with Havana. “Now that they have killed Dr. King, there will be no Negro leader who can tell his brothers not to burn their cities,” Carmichael exulted in his long-distance call. A few days later, CORE Director Floyd McKissick also spoke by phone with Havana, saying of King’s death: “With his death, the ideology of non-violence also died. . . once more the United States has shown the world that this is a violent nation. . .”

The Viet Cong, whose tactics are being studied and copied by Black Power advocates in this country, also got into the act. Hoang Binh Son, identified by Havana’s *Radio Liberacion* as head of the Viet Cong Mission to Cuba, said that the shooting of Dr. King would make peace negotiations with Hanoi more difficult, claiming that the Viet Cong “resolved to intensify our offensive to defeat the Yankee aggressors, enemies of their Negro people and people all around the world.” A statement by McKissick was read over the radio in conjunction with that of the Viet Cong representative to Havana: “You cannot teach the people to be non-violent while we are involved in a violent war in Vietnam. . .”

RADIO PROPAGANDA OFFENSIVE

Radio Liberacion's 150,000 watt station, three times the size of any single radio station in this country, is being readied to launch a propaganda offensive this summer to incite U.S. Negroes to riot. Testimony given before the Senate Sub-Committee on Internal Security on March 7, 1967 indicates that Cuba's new radio potency can blank out 47 stations in the United States in proximity to the east coast and the gulf coast. A group of renegade U.S. citizens, calling themselves North American Friends of the Cuban Revolution, are readying a propaganda offensive.

Headed by an American, identified by *Radio Liberacion* as Lionel Martin, the U.S. subversives will commence broadcasts in English to the United States, reportedly in conjunction with the "Poor People's March" on Washington, scheduled for mid-May. Some observers are convinced that the thrust of

guidance from Havana—written and broadcast—will attend efforts to burn our nation's capital to the ground. Many are alarmed at the Federal Government's refusal to acknowledge Havana's long history of identification with the Black Power movement, and still more find it inexplicable that Stokely Carmichael and other Black Power militants are permitted freely to walk the streets of cities they have vowed to destroy.

NEGROES, WHITES LIVE EQUAL IN CUBA—"LIKE ANIMALS"

Eighteen Cuban Negroes escaped on April 14, hijacking a train and driving it to the U.S. Naval Base. Most of them were in their teens. Sandra Gores, age 18, said upon her arrival in Miami: "In all fairness, I've got to say that Negroes and whites are treated equally in Cuba

today—treated like animals." She and her companions made the final mile from where the railroad tracks ended to the fence of the Guantanamo Naval Base by dodging machine-gun bullets pumped at them by Cuban border guards and dashing through swampland and a maze of barbed wire erected by the Castro regime. One was killed.

The train was seized by the Cuban Negroes—13 men and 5 girls—as it was traversing the few miles from the small town of Caimanera to Boqueron. An interesting point: the 18 Cuban Negroes said they made the dash to freedom despite Communist propaganda that the shooting of Martin Luther King was proof that Negroes in the United States were set upon by dogs and killed without cause in city streets. "The only dogs I've seen," escapee Osiris Vazquez, a student, told *Latin America Report*, "are those that Castro's border guards set upon us when we made it to the fence around Guantanamo Base."

CHILE:

"REVOLUTION IN LIBERTY" OR LEFT-WING TOTALITARIANISM?

Last month, Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey repeated a gaff made earlier by President Johnson in January of 1967, when he invited Chile's President Eduardo Frei to the United States as a State guest. In making the invitation, President Johnson called Frei's party, the Christian Democrats, the "party of revolution in liberty." This intrusion into Chile's internal affairs was rebuffed when the Chilean Senate promptly responded by refusing to permit President Frei to leave the country. Yet, on March 27, Vice President Humphrey again referred to the Christian Democrats as "pioneers in revolution with liberty."

The occasion for Mr. Humphrey's remark was a State Department function honoring departing Chilean Ambassador to Washington, Radomiro Tomic. The

Vice President found that Frei's programs to change the social and economic structure of Chile a highly stimulating task, said that Chile was a strong supporter of the Organization of American States, and lauded Ambassador Tomic as a true friend of the United States, saying: "He now is returning to his country to continue his collaboration with President Frei on the road to revolution with liberty. . ."

Unfortunately, what President Johnson and Vice President Humphrey say about President Frei, Ambassador Tomic and the Christian Democrats not only is untrue, but, by their well publicized statements, make the United States the laughing stock of Latin America. The facts are that the Chilean government has accepted the compliments and taken

the staggering sum of \$764 million in Alliance for Progress funds, while insulting the United States and opposing virtually every single U.S. foreign policy objective aimed at stopping the Communist advance.

Here are a few of those facts:

✓ Back in 1965, Ambassador Tomic accused the United States of "dealing with Latin America as though it owned it," and attacked U.S. and OAS intervention in the Dominican Republic. The Chilean Ambassador has been particularly vocal in condemning the United States for its role in Vietnam, saying that the war is too expensive, may lead to atomic war and can be expected to yield only "negative results."

✓ Contrary to Vice President Humphrey's lyricism over Tomic's desire to

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support Frei, news reports out of Chile state that he plans to return home and form a Leftist coalition of Marxist groups to support his own candidacy for President in 1970. Tomic is on record as being anti-business and pro-State planning, prompting Fidel Castro to say on April 19: "The Yankees have been preparing him for the presidency, and he is trying to get the backing of the Communist Party of Chile."

✓ Chile's much-propagandized agrarian reform has given land to nobody. Property was confiscated from landowners by the Christian Democrats, but has not been given over to peasants. Instead, the land has been divided into parcels called "asentamientos" and settlers placed on them. The settlers are required to sell their crops to the government's Agrarian Reform Corporation and billed for assistance at the end of each crop year. Worse, the government claims that it has created new property owners and has refused to the settlers the State's social security

coverage on the fiction that they are employers of labor and therefore not entitled to it. The result: last year Chile had to import \$200 million of foodstuffs, despite the fact that it has 25 per cent more arable land per capita than the United States.

✓ Two years ago, President Frei turned a copy of Alliance for Progress plans for Chilean development over to Communist Czechoslovakia.

✓ The Christian Democratic Youth is allied with the Czechoslovak Youth Union and has joined the FRAP (Chilean Communist) youth coalition in demanding "the total eradication of Yankee economic and political influence from Latin America."

✓ The regime of President Frei has not supported the Organization of American States, as claimed by Vice President Humphrey. It has flouted it. President Frei has permitted the Havana-based OLAS to open an office in Santiago and, in the face of evidence to the contrary,

stated that Cuba should not be blamed for the outbreak of guerrilla wars in Latin America. Only last month, Frei extended asylum to five members of "Che" Guevara's guerrilla band, who fled to Chile from Bolivia and arranged for a plane to pick them up and return them to Cuba. He did so in flagrant violation of the several treaty commitments entered into by members of the OAS, and refused an extradition request made by Bolivia.

✓ After boasting that they would oust Communist leadership from Chile's labor organization, CUTCH, the Christian Democrats actually turned over their six seats on CUTCH's Executive Committee to the FRAP coalition. By their weakness, the CD gratuitously handed over 60 per cent of Chile's labor force to the Communists.

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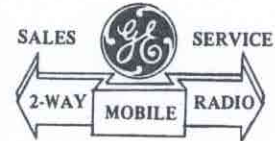

No man in public life was ever persecuted and maligned because of his beliefs as was the late U.S. Senator Joseph R. Mc Carthy. All of the phoney martyrs of "Ordeal By Slander" placed together never absorbed a fraction of the abuse that was heaped upon him. Joe took it all with chin out-thrust, without a whimper and stuck to his guns. Such a man was Joseph R. McCarthy, stalwart defender of our U.S.

In my humble opinion, he has left for us, his followers, a precious heritage: we are overcome with a surge of determination to carry out his fight against all odds, as he so often did singlehanded. His actions have prompted a new word to be coined, "McCarthyism," to live forever in the hearts of men, symbolizing his dedication to his church, his country above all, and constantly to his family. Love and courage have always outlived hatred and cowardice, and already I can feel Joseph Raymond McCarthy's coming triumph.

I wonder how many people know that the U.S. Government Printing Office, Washington, D.C., printed a hard cover bound book comprised of 353 pages containing Memorial Addresses and Eulogies issued in 1957. I have my copy and there is duly inscribed by me on the inside cover: "If the torch dropped by his dying and is not picked up and held aloft, then God help our poor beloved land."

I would like to quote a passage from a letter addressed to me and written by Joe's widow, Jean McCarthy, dated June 4, 1957, in answer to my letter of heartfelt sympathy, dated May 2, 1957. I quote: "When Joe came home to Appleton (Wisconsin), the heart and soul of

this country was standing along the roadside on the 30 mile drive from Green Bay. It was all of that that made Joe and all of that to which he dedicated his life. It was the reason for his sacrifice of personal comfort, the reason for his courage to withstand being alone at times.

"Joe once said in answer to the question 'What can I do to help?' 'Look to your schools, search behind the printed word, give purpose to and demand a contract from the men you send to man the watchtowers in Washington, D.C.' (and of Joe's quote) If everyone of Joe's friends took that suggestion to heart, I would then know God's purpose had been done.

"May I add an afterthought I know Joe would share. That is, never underestimate your power as a citizen. When Joe walked into his first open clash with the wrecking crew of our nation, he had in his mind—and this he has written—'the thought of those real people who are the heart and soul of America; thoughts of the young people in my office, toiling night and day. . . thoughts of the many young men, friends of mine, who went to their death in the Pacific for what they thought was a better world. . . those thoughts convinced me that this fight I had to win.' (End of Joe's quote.)

"Perhaps now, a few more will stop to think that a man with the intellect and the courage, the drive and the honesty, a man such as Joe—with his love for life—could not have spent all that without reason. Perhaps a few more will search their minds and step with decision to the side of right."

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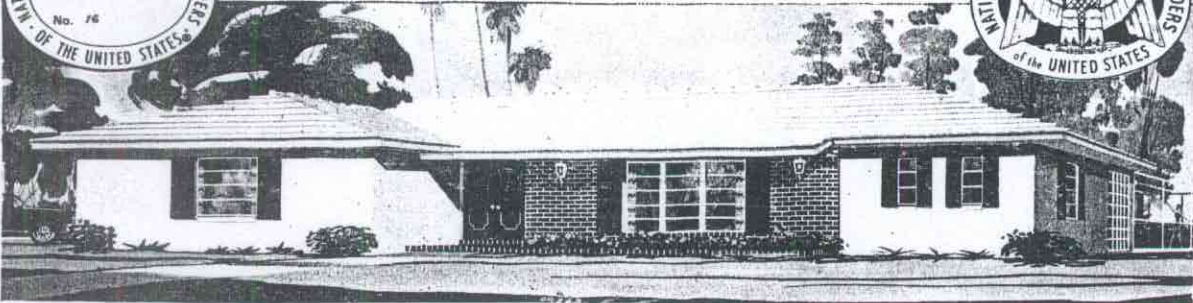

year to crush a coup against the pro-Paris Gabon government, without raising a ripple.

Some U.S. officials suspect the hand of de Gaulle is somewhere behind the revocation of the peace corps from Gabon, a country which provides uranium to France.

The ties between Paris and most of its former African territories are almost as strong as before independence.

The Organization of African Unity, which includes all-black ruled nations, has been foundering, but the 14-nation French-speaking Afro-Malagasy joint organization, known as OCAM for its initials in French, gains stature and influence.

OCAM countries include some 58 million people—one-third the population of black-ruled, sub-Sahara Africa. They depend on agriculture, but also boast

iron ore, uranium, gold, bauxite, diamonds and oil deposits.

OCAM is basically a conservative group except for the Brazzaville Congo which flirts with Communist China. Even Brazzaville relies heavily on France.

Most OCAM nations have mutual defense pacts with Paris and some 6,600 French troops are based in several strategic spots of its former African empire.

French aid to Africa, almost all of it to French-speaking areas, was 465 million dollars in 1966. U.S. to Africa last year was 169 million dollars.

French aid buys considerable influence. Frenchmen occupy high government posts in African capitals to administer the aid and the influence. Almost 12,000 French government workers and technicians live in Africa. More than 90 percent of high school teachers in the Ivory Coast are French.

Countries which might be inclined to

resist French influence can reflect on the troubles of Guinea and Dahomey before doing anything which might upset Paris.

France was so irritated by Dahomey's fourth coup in five years that it suspended the \$10 million a year Paris provided to keep the unstable West African country afloat.

Guinea decided before independence to go it alone after 1960 rather than lean on French help. French technicians left and took with them everything, from telephone wire to toilet seats.

Most French-speaking leaders in black Africa revere de Gaulle as their father figure, much in the style of a powerful tribal chief.

"I consider the General my adopted father," says Gen. Jean Bedel Bokassa, head of the military government in the Central African Republic.
