

Bill to Open Interpol Files

Legislation was introduced in Congress to extend Freedom of Information Act provisions to files kept on Americans by Interpol, the international police organization.

The bill, introduced last week by Rep. Edward Beard (D-R.I.), would require any information on Americans kept by Interpol overseas be made available for recall if requested under the Freedom of Information Act.

It would require the United States to withdraw from participation in the semi-private organization if Interpol does not comply with the law.
