Dear Lou,

I have a letter from Marge Kirkpatrick Jerome today in which she reports Herman of the Secret Service has retired, that she was phoned by an agent named Wamp, who told her that they had asked only that Godfrey be "watched" because he is an "unstable personality". I am not satisfied and have written her asking her to get a complete medical note from the hospital and, in writing, from the Secret Service, a statement of why they consider him, of all the "unstablers" in the country, requiring watching for the security of the President. The hospital interprets whatever the Secret Service told it as an order to keep him underlock and key. They would not let him get for a walk on the grounds with me.

I told her to ask the Secret Service for everything they have, particularly why they consider him a threat to the President.

The handwriting is being worked on. Checked yesterday. The question now is determining which is in the handwriting of interest because those papers can be filed by another, need not be executed by the principal.
