Dear you,

I ask that you keep this in strictest confidence. The reason will become clear. I mean, please don't discuss it with anyone, and with all on everyone's mind now, this would also be better for them.

Some time back I asked for what you were supposed to have given me copies of when I got it for you, Roger Lovin's records on the Discordian Society. It was not idle curiosity or I'd have kept after you when I gave these things to you. They meant little to me then. Now however, I have this specific interest:

I am checking out for the office of several of the better Senators a really sophisticated threat against at least one. If anything, this may be too learned and sophisticated for Hornley. There is much farout stuff in it. But we have made much sense out of it, too. Some of the stuff in it was too much for the Secret Service, which is not made up of people who can recall Luke, Chapter 19, verse 40 when they see a phoney return address (this is the real case here, and it is an appropriate citation for such a threat). They do not recognize some of the words not in their office dictionaries as having meanings from the past, some known to me, others immediately available from the unabridged dictionaries.

There may be clues in some of the wierd things in that Discordian file. Therefore my interest. I hope you can send this soon. There is always the chance that such a threat can be intended seriously.
