Persuant to your suggestion we yesterdaym simmailed you a copy of CHITECASH and are looking forward to getting a copy of your Truth bout The Kennedy Assassination. I presume this is in German, in whichIwas never fluent and which I can now not read at all. Should you at some time have an english ms. svailable I'd like to read it. Weanwhile, among others interested in the case and from whom I've heard expressions of interest in your book, now doubt there are some who will want to read it in German.

It is only technically true that "HITETARH was only "recently" published. There was, as you perhaps know, a monolithic publishers' resistance to the subject, extending also to agents. The book was done in mid-Pebruary 1985. I turned out a limited edition on August of that year, followed by the first of four generally-distributed but still private printings in May of this tear. In the United States it was the first of the books on the Commission. In my case I make a distinction and address myself to the Report. I believe nothing material has been added to my initial work (by others. My own additions will soon be forthcoming) and that collectively the others have not approximated it. This may be an author's vanity but you can soon judge for tourself.

Penn Jones, Jr., who has followed the strenge upsetting of the actuarial tables in Dellas very closely - a dedicated and demogratic weekly newspaper editor in them old end fine American tradition - has also thined out a private printing of a book. His is entitled "Forgive my Grief". It reports on these strange deaths. He is currently making some public appearances under the auspicies of Ramperts, which has conveniently omitted noting the existence of his book from which most of its coming issue is taken, instead referring to the original use of this material in his paper. I was in machington when you'letter came trying to help attract attention to his press conference this morning. I think there will be some attention to it in the Juropean press. Or, to put it more precisely, I am confident a number of European journalists will attend it.

The is also to appear in New York, and I understind Routers has already moved a piece.
