Ray Did Not Kill King, Says Author

Munich, Germany

James Farl Ray did not fail Dr. Martin Luther Wing Jr., a German-American author charged in an open letter to Judge W. Preston Battle of the Memphis (Tenn.) criminal court.

Joachim Joesten, author of such books as "The Dark Side of Lyndon B. Johnson," "The Garvison Inquiry" and "Oswald: Assassin or Fall Guy?" said in his letter he has prepared a 45,000-word documentation on the case which he is mailing to Battle, the American Civil Liberties Union and a few newspapers.

He claimed Ray was charged with murder by the state of Tennessee "on the basis of a deliberately false and fraudulent FBI report."

According to Joesten, "the FBI knows that Ray did not commit the murder and is trying to shield, through the sacrifice of a scapegoat, the real assassin of Dr. King whose identity is well known to the FBI."

He claimed that Ray, because of his criminal recordand his involvement in the conspiracy to kill King, has been put under pressure to plead guilty in return fer promise of lealency.
