

## THE CLIPBOARD

Statements of Witnesses - Frankie KAISER, April 8, 1964, 6 H 341-5

He has been employed as a warehouseman by the School Book Depository for about 2 years. He has an <sup>9</sup>th grade education. (p.341)

He was not at work the day of the assassination. He was having abscessed teeth cared for. He describes the place where he found the clipboard as "right next to the stairway - right in the corner." He also said it was "right in front of the elevator." (p.342)

The clipboard was lying on the floor. (p.343)

Ball has three pictures marked Kaiser Exhibits A, B, and C (20 H 334-5) saying they have been discussed in the testimony, but actually only A was.

Although excused following his brief deposition beginning at 2:30 p.m., Kaiser was recalled at 3:40.

The clipboard was made of cardboard and tape. (p.344)

He testified he found Exhibit 163, a blue jacket, in the window sill of the domino room. The supposed picture shows the jacket other than where it was, but he says it was the jacket he found. (Compare this with the very specific testimony of Frazier about the color and nature of the material of the jacket Oswald wore to work.) Note also that ~~Kaiser~~<sup>Kaiser</sup> was not at work on the 22nd, 23rd, or 24th. Note also he is not asked when the "found" it.

Shown Exhibit C and asked if that shows the windowsill where the jacket was found, he corrects the exhibit which shows a hand pointing to the far corner of the pair of large windows with a board in front of the sill almost creating a box like a large windowbox, he puts a mark to show the spot where the jacket was found and initialed it in the opposite corner.
