Dear Mr. Weisberg,

I know that you are an extremely busy man and I will say what I have to as briefly as I am able so that you are not delayed in your work.

Some time ago, I wrote you to register my indignation at the manner in which Jim Lesar was treated at the recent assassination conference at N.Y.U.

In the interim period, my friend and room mate (who, for no nefarious purpose, signs himself alternately as Robert Bruce or Bruce Moskowitz - I wasn't sure whose he signed himself when writing you.) has written you and sent you some newspaper clippings. Yesterday, he told me by phone that you asked him if he might be able to do some research for you at the N.Y.U. Law library. I am writing to inform you that come September I will be studying law at Brooklyn Law School and would like to offer my services to do research for you in New York City if you are able in any manner to use me. I still know a professor or two at N.Y.U. and am sure that I could gain use of the N.Y.U. Law library (which generally does not admit even N.Y.U. undergraduates) in addition to the facilities at Brooklyn.

I would consider myself fairly well-versed in writings on the J.F.K. assassination (including your own "Whitewash I & the Photographic Whitewash" - I have also, incidentally, read your excellent book on the King case - "Frame-Up") and have some knowledge of legal procedure including a familiarity with the provisions of the Federal Freedom of Information Act.



I sincerely hope that I may be of some service to you because Dallas still weighs heavily on my mind. I will be moving to Brooklyn with my room mate in about 3 weeks or so. Until then, I may be reached at the following address.
