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Dear Harold,

Thanks for your recent letter. I always appreciate hearing from you and getting your insights.

I am trudging through the Hersh book, amidst my reading and study of my art history course. I had reservations about putting forth the money invested in it, and in a sense feel that way more while reading it. On the other hand, I try to read a variety of sources on important and controversial subjects and have, of course, the friendly bias by and about Robert, Ted, and Jack by themselves in some cases, and the likes of Sorenson, Schlesinger, and others, as well as the stuff by Hersh, both Reeves's and Nigel Hamilton.

On the plus side, what I have found is at least the source of some of the rumors about Kennedy - identified, some credible, some not, some are very third-hand. That part was disappointing. It is also very dry, and some of the conclusions are not clear from the sources provided. And by admission, some of these sources have general credibility problems of their own. As I read, I can pass that, annotated, along to you, if you are not reading them directly.
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I don't think there is any question that Joe Kennedy set the tone for his children's behavior and it has visited his family for generations. Some of this arrogance has brought forth some positive things: an energetic boost to the American public in general, the Peace Corps, a vibrancy, restoration of art and culture in the White House, and, even in death, the Civil Rights Act.

In regard to the Cuban Missile Crisis, I have 3 sources - Robert Kennedy's 13 Days in October, The Kennedy Imprisonment and The Bay of Pigs (not specifically about missile crisis, but background). The revisionist stuff says a crisis was created and we actually gave more than we got. I'm not sure. I am thankful he didn't just ignore the presence of the missiles, of course, that they sent in nuclear armed submarines later is another problem. I remember going to bed the night of his address thinking we would not wake up. It seems clear that if Khrushchev backed down, Brezhnev took that as an incentive to boost Soviet missile production, creating in some areas, though not in all, the missile gap that Kennedy claimed existed in the campaign of 1960, that did not.

You and I likely disagree on the effect, other than the obvious moral considerations, of presidential sexual misconduct, on his ability to do his job. Frankly, I think it is unconscionable for a president to put himself in the position of being blackmailed in any number of ways. To me clearly, Kennedy's relationship with Judith Exner did this, as well as Clinton's current problem. It is unacceptable to me that Clinton should be at the mercy of a 24-year-old intern. She is not blameless, after all, she knew he is married. How can he deal with Iraq, the Middle East, Bosnia, or any of this with these problems? The American public can be forgiving, but they expected it to stop, and don't like being made fools of. Arrogance begets overconfidence. Clinton has no limits. Philosophy aside.
