You will find that I made immediate request for secene to what was transferred to the Mational archives by the representative of the Kannedy estate, in percent to Dr. Mahmer, then archivist, and thereafter, at his sugmention, made a more limited and appealfic request, in writing, for phin to forward to the representative of the estate.

Separately, I have written the archivist for equality of access and offered to have a properly qualified pathologist should be require this.
