

Ted Kennedy Agrees With Warren Report

Hasn't Read It,

He Says, but Is Sure
Oswald Acted Alone

Washington, Aug. 1—(UPI)—
Sen. Edward M. (Ted) Kennedy
(D-Mass) says that although he
has not read the Warren Com-
mission report — and “I do not
intend to” — he is convinced
that Lee Harvey Oswald alone
killed his brother, President
John F. Kennedy.

The 34-year-old senator was
asked in an interview about re-
cent books questioning the va-
lidity of the Warren Commis-
sion's findings regarding the
assassination in Dallas in No-
vember, 1963.

Covers Face

He winced and covered his
face with one hand. After a
moment of silence, he lowered
his hand and replied firmly:

“I never read the Warren
Commission report. However,
I am satisfied that it represents
at least conclusively the results
which I believe are accurate. I
have not read it. And I do not
intend to do so.”

The tone of Kennedy's voice
made clear that was all he
would say on the subject.

Fresh Controversy

Fresh controversy about the
assassination has been aroused
recently, chiefly by the publica-
tion of a book by Edward Jay
Epstein, a Harvard graduate
student, who said the Warren
report was hastily prepared, in-
accurate and incomplete and
did not prove its principal find-
ing that Oswald acted alone.

This led to suggestions Os-
wald might have had an accom-
plice or have acted as part of
a conspiracy.

Epstein's book prompted
Richard N. Goodwin, a former
aide to the late President, to
suggest last week that an in-
dependent panel look into the
charges and, if necessary, that
Congress establish a new board
to seek new evidence.
