Feminists Seized At Nixon Offices

NEW YORK, Oct. 23 (AP)—Attorney Florynce Kennedy and feminist Ti-Grace Atkinson were arrested today when they refused to move on while demonstrating in front of President Nixon's campaign headquarters.

About 50 women's rights activists, protesting the President's position on child care

and abortion, appeared in costumes in front of the Madison Avenue offices and threw candy kisses to spectators, shouting "Kiss off Nixon."

Mrs. Kennedy, Miss Atkinson and four other demonstrators were charged with disorderly conduct. Police said the women were blocking the sidewalks and traffic.

The women were dressed in shrouds and carried posters reading, "Kiss abortion repeal goodbye with Nixon," and "Nixon kisses Kissinger and bombs children."

Miss Atkinson, a registered Republican, said she opposed the President because he "is committed to the structure of oppression, and since these structures are built upon the backs of women, Nixon can never be for women."

One of the earliest theoreticians of the feminist movement, Miss Atkinson said she had been spending the last year with the Mafia to learn its tactics to live outside the law so that women could do the same.
