

RFK ASSASSINATION CASE REOPENED — The Robert Kennedy assassination case of 1968 has been ordered reopened to determine whether there may have been a second gunman in the Los Angeles hotel pantry where he was killed. Superior Court Judge Robert Wenke approved a suit yesterday calling for refiring of the pistol which was wrestled from Sirhan Sirhan after a dozen eyewitnesses saw him firing bullets into the senator's body. Sirhan was convicted of first-degree murder in the case and is serving a life sentence. But there have been recent claims that bullets removed from Kennedy's body did not match one removed from a bystander wounded in the shooting.
