Thank you very much for your letter of the 6th and the enclosed essay.

Of course you may see what I have when you are near here in June. It will please me because I want them to be used as much as possible.

One thing in particular I recommend because, given the mass of FBI materials, most of which are irrelevant and just plain junk, without time there is virtually no real access. It took me years of fighting to get it and I'm surprised Garrow didn't use it when I showed it to him; the inventory of field office only records on Dr. King and his associates. Can you imagine that the inventory alone is 400 typed pages?

We are about a mile from the closer edge of Baltimore and less than that from the nearer part of Washington. My phone is 301/473-8186.

If you let me know when to expect you, I'll adjust my time. For medical reasons I go to a nearby mall even morning to walk because I can sit and raise a damaged leg wherever that is necessary. I generally return about 10:30-11:00 a.m., after three hours of that therapy. But I can shorten the time or eliminate a morning if your schedule indicates it.

I have a portable typewriter in the basement, where those files are, and an ample supply of paper, so you need not encumber yourself with either. Also a table for working or writing. There is a typewriter table for it, too.

We have a copier and can offer to make a reasonable number of copies. My old machine is wearing out and at my age I don't want to have to replace it.
