SUBJECT: SANITATION WORKERS STRIKE
MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE

Assistant Director ^{U.S.M.} ~~JOE~~ SULLIVAN telephonically communicated with me at approximately 10 a.m., 3/29/68.

Mr. SULLIVAN is most interested in the activities, both official and personal, of KING while in Memphis, Tennessee. SULLIVAN is interested in any improper conduct on the part of KING. He had hoped that we would have had coverage which would have made this information available. Mr. SULLIVAN requested that we get everything possible on KING and that we stay on him until he leaves Memphis. He also requested that he be furnished the names of the two women who left the march with KING, along with five other men on 3/28/68.

I immediately discussed the above with SA LOWE, who is endeavoring to obtain the names of the women through the Memphis PD. He also is endeavoring through the PD to determine whether there is any indication if improper action on the part of KING, since he has been at the Rivermont Hotel.
