Pursuant to your instructions, information is set forth below regarding discontinuance of the telephone surveillance on the Atlanta, Georgia, residence of Martin Luther King, Jr.

The above-mentioned telephone surveillance was discontinued on April 30, 1965, when King changed residences in Atlanta. At that time matters of interest to us pertaining to King and his organization, the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), were being obtained through a telephone surveillance on the Atlanta headquarters of SCLC. This telephone surveillance on SCLC in Atlanta was in existence from November 8, 1963, to June 21, 1966, when former Attorney General Nicholas de Katzenbach ordered it discontinued because of the involvement of an SCLC official (Hoshea Williams) in a car theft case.

Attached is a copy of Atlanta airtel May 19, 1965, showing the discontinuance of the telephone surveillance on King on April 30, 1965.
