In connection with investigation being conducted in the MURKIN case, the main Bureau file on Martin Luther King, Jr.'s activities (100-106670) was reviewed. It is to be noted that for several years numerous threats against King were brought to our attention. They are as follows:

ORAL THREATS:

By letter to the Director 12/23/63, (original the Tampa Office reported that one made derogatory statements against the Attorney General and late President Kennedy. He allegedly stated that the Attorney General and Martin Luther King "would get theirs" within thirty days. AKA "Catfish," the Grand Wizard of North Carolina, Knights of the KKK on June 9, 1966, gave a reporter a written statement King; that he was going to Mississippi for the purpose of killing die happy if necessary. Ser. 2596 is a DE teletype to the Director on 6/18/66, reporting an anonymous caller had alleged a plot to kill King and that plotters were connected with KKK and employed by Cadillac Plant #1, Detroit, Michigan, and also that Grand Dragon of this Klan was possibly involved. The "Grand Dragon" was identified by the DE Office as JOHN HOLLIS DAVIS, AKA Jack Davis of South Gate, Michigan,

Ser. 2761 is a teletype dated 11/3/66, from Chicago advising that the Chicago NAACP on that date received an anonymous telephone call at 9:40 a.m. threatening King. The caller stated that one "

is aware of a person who is offering \$10,000 for the assassination of King, if King returns to Chicago. This anonymous call was of a local nature and no extortion case was opened, and Chicago had no references in its indices on

Ser. 2872 is a Chicago airtel 3/31/67, reporting information received from Army Intelligence that one who claimed to be a minuteman, reportedly told another soldier that he and another minuteman comprised a sabotage team which would undertake assassination of King. was interviewed and denied membership or association with the minutemen, but considered one consider

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Ser. 926 is an article and photograph from the "Harald Examiner," Los Angeles, California, dated 2/26/65, which refers to heavy security pracaution concerning threats on King's life. The article alludes to a search for one KEITH D. GILBERT, 27, 419 Western Avenue, Glendale, California. The article states GILBERT is known as a racist and involved in theft of dynamite, which was found in his apartment along with minuteman literature. MM airtel to Director 3/5/65, entitled.

refers to one GILBERT, not further identified, who reportedly had the dynamite to be used on King.

3/2/65, at LA concerning one KEITH DWAYNE GILBERT related an incident where GILBERT shot at Negroes in a car and was arrested by LAPD 9/18/64, for attempt to commit murder. GILBERT reportedly a co-owner fo a gun shop. LHM also refers to one GEORGE WILLARD, who was a member of the John Birch Society.

Ser. 1498 is an LHM from NO dated 6/16/65, reports a remark made by one Rouge, Louisiana, that Negro race needs a new "monument" as Christ has been dead 2,000 years and it would be better if King or James Farmer were killed.

Ser. 1696 TP teletype to Director 8/2/65, reports that.

Florida Pioneer Club, (independent Klan group) claimed an unknown male at an unspecified place in Alabama, was allegedly appointed to "do away" with King at St. Augustine, Florida or Washington, D. C. on an unknown date.

Ser. 2158 AT teletype 12/13/65, reported that an assistant of King received a telephone call from a male individual who stated he was Mr. Chew (phonetic)

Denver, Colorado. "CHEW" told King's assistant that King should be careful as someone was going to assassinate him. A notation on Ser. 2158 indicates the caller may be one HOLT CHEW,

ber. 862 airtel from KC 2/16/65, reflects that claimed he was approached by unknown party on 2/15/65, to kill the President and King. reflects that reportedly an alcoholic.

A news clipping from the Birmingham Newspaper, Birmingham, Alabama, dated 9/28/62, is an article stating that ROY JAMES, 24, 6150 Wilson Boulevard, Arlington, Virginia, reportedly struck King twice and received \$25 fine and 30 days in jail. JAMES reportedly a Lieutenant in the American Mazi Party. He is also said to have a long police record in demonstrations and other incidents.

ser. 1062 reports information on 3/26/65, that California, a former John Dircher, arregedly considered King a Communist tool. He is reported to have sail, "I am going to get Mortin Luther King, he is mine."

In an LHM dated 2/27/68, at San Francisco, informamade extreme anti-Negro, anti-left, and anti-liberal statements in November and December, 1967. allegedly named numerous persons he considered traitors and said they should be disposed of, meaning they should be killed. He specifically mentioned President Johnson, ernator Robert Kennedy, H. Rap Brown, Stokley Carmichael, and Martin Luther King.

Ser. 324 CV radiogram to Director 3/18/64, reflects

WRITTEN THREATS:

On 7/7/64, and 3/26/65, anonymous letters were sent to the editor of the "Charlotte Observer," Charlotte, North Carolina, critical of President Johnson, Vice President Humphrey, Chief Justice Warren and King. The first letter expressed opposition to integration and was highly critical of the Kennedy and Johnson administration and included King, and indicated a grave might be a good place for them. The later letter also highly critical contained a statement, "Old Martin Luther King should get his brains blown out. ." These letters were examined by the FBI Laboratory and searched through the anonymous letter file without success.
