May I be furnished certified information as to medication and treatment received by Godfrey Kirkpatrick since his admission in East Louisiana Hospital? Also may I have names of doctors and attendants who have worked with him, as well as the names of his social workers?

This is very important to me, most necessary, as we are gathering data on the case of Godfrey Kirkpatrick for the records.

I was of course concerned by Godfrey's suicide attempt. I had sought to prevent this by allowing Godfrey weekend visits. Last summer Godfrey had told us that he intended to accomplish his death if he could never be allowed a visit to the outside world. I can't say that I can blame him; can you?

I hope that I may hear from you at your earliest convenience, and trust that you will understand my interest in the case.
