This is not because your story does not interest me nor is it because I did not look into such matters and write about them while you were engaged in them.

I will refer your letter of the 13th to another.

Meanwhile, may I suggest that you prepare an outline?

I would then also refer it.

In it I would suggest emphasis on first-person experiences and what is not known, what has not been published.

Much has been published about the Gestapo and its murders, as you know.

Any publisher therefore has to have reason to believe a book would contain what he could sell, what would interest people and make them want to buy the book.

In my previous letter I asked you to send unmarked copies of your more recent correspondence with the FBI. They might be of use in one of my suits.
