Dear Congressman Ruppel,

Because I do not recall if I sent you a copy of the third of my multipart "Report On The Warren Report" when I got the first copies from the printer, I am sending you one ~~separately~~ now.

It got about 40 inches as news in the New York Times, but no mention that I am aware of in any other paper, and I sent plenty out. I also left releases in the Press Club saying where free copies were available. I know of not a single one being asked for.

This is but part of the material I told Mr. Kaufman I have. My book on the New Orleans aspect of the case, completed in early April, will soon be out.

And I am not done. I do wish you had availed yourself of my offer of access to my data. But I will publish it, and I hope to have it all out soon.

As you should be able to see here, even were the autopsy close to right, the facts could not be altered by it and it could in no way authenticate the report and its wrong conclusions.
