Thanks for your thoughtful letter. Our list is enclosed. I write more in fairness to the memory of the man who was, for his day, one of the better genators, as 1 then bedieved. I am, by the way, a Democrat.

It was difficult for me to understand how men I respect, like Warren and Cooper, could sign that Report. I can't take time for all I learned after writing my first book but I came to understand that while Warren knew what he was doing, no innocence there, he did believe it was in the country's interest and he had been connied by LBJ and intimidated by J. Elgar Hoover. To a lesser degree this is true of all the Members including Cooper. But they were all too busy to do justice to that responsibility and for all the efforts they made they could not be fully aware of the evidence that, biased as it was, destroyed the conclusions of the Report. Bill Neichter, a Louisville lawyer and a friend, has been trying to improve the Cooper archive. He learned that Cooper took the Commission secrecy so literally he shared nothing with his staff and aside from his many Senate responsibilities spent hours each week going over the enormous load of what was a essentially irrelevant dumped on them by the staff. But as I learned from Russell, Cooper was cith him in his vigorous opposition to the single bullet theory and refused to sign the Report with that in it. Rankin and Warren worked out what they presented as a compromise that incorpor ated Russell's and Cooper's objections but it was a con, it was saying the same thing in different words, which neither Russell nor Cooper understand. To a limited degree I go into this in WW IV. I've learned more since then. It was in fairness to Cooper's memory that when Norris' producer phoned I said I'd like people in Kentucky to know a little of the truth. If there had been more time I could have said more. I had what "ussell prepared in advance of an executive session he forced by refusing to sign the Report, with Cooper's agreement, and I was prepared to read part of it, along with Cooper's agreement with it.
