## Into Kennedy, King & Wallace Shootings by CHRIS FULLER

Forty-six U.S. congressmen are demanding a "full and complete investigation" by the House of Representatives into the assassinations of John F. Kennedy, Robert Kennedy and Martin Luther King and the attempted slaying of George

Spurring the demand is sensational testimony before the Warren Commission by Jackie Kennedy — published here for the first time — that deepens doubts about two of the commission's basic findings.

Investigators believe her testimony challenges the commission's conclusions that JFK was shot from the rear by a lone gunman — Lee Harvey Oswald — and that the same bullet struck both the President

and then-Texas Gov. John Connally.

Giving voice to the suspicions that are swirling around the corridors of Congress, Rep. Henry Gonzalez (D. Tex.) said he sees a "possible pattern" in the three murders and the Wallace

shooting.

And Rep. Charles H. Wilson (D.-Calif.) agreed: "There could be links in all three assassinations and in the attempt on Wallace's life."

Gonzalez has introduced a resolution in the House of Representatives, cosponsored by 45 of his colleagues—Democrats and Republicans—urging creation of a select seven-member House panel to investigate the crimes.

Gonzalez hopes to add more cosponsors by the end of the year, when he plans to bring the proposal to the House floor for a vote.

The resolution would direct the special committee "to conduct a full and a complete investigation and study of the circumstances surrounding the death of John F. Kennedy, Robert F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King and the attempted assassination of George Wallace."

Gonzalez said that before the Watergate scandal, "I didn't pay much attention to investigators who repeatedly
claimed there was a massive conspiracy to cover up the JFK assassination.

"If think it's more than coincidence that Hunt had been head of the CIAs station in Mexico City and that Lee Harvey Oswald made a mysterious visit to Mexico City shortly before the assassination," he said.

"I have never mentioned this to any one before. But when the first shot sounded, the cars were already at a complete halt or just crawling," he told The ENQUIRER.

"Odd that we should have come to a virtual stop even before the first shot, at that exact spot."

A major point troubling congressmen is testimony to the Warren Commission by President Kennedy's widow that investigators insist shows JFK was shot from the front.

In the testimony — declassified in 1972 but published here by The EN-QUIRER for the first time in any publication — Jackie said:

"I remember a voice behind fie, or something, and then I remembered the people in the front seat finally, or somebody knew something was wrong, and a voice yelling, which must have been Mr. Hill, 'get to the hospital,' or maybe it was Mr. Kellerman, in the

The former First Lady's previously unpublished testimony also disputes the commission's finding that Gov. Connally, riding in the front seat of the Kennedy car, was wounded by the same bullet that pierced the President's head.
