

Dear Jim, House committee/Lane

Mo Waldron and I have had several phone conversations today. During one he told me he'd be phoning Sprague. During another he said that Sprague's most common response was "no comment." Except for a total denial on interviewing Castro now.

Earlier he'd asked me to read what I think may be the basis for the leak to the Post of this past weekend. I had them out but forgot to read him CDs 1359 and 984. So I called him and did. While we were talking he told me that a note had just been passed to him telling him that an old friend of mine was on the phone for him.

Lane.

I asked him to whom he had spoken since getting in Washington or who knew he was in Washington.

Sprague.

I guess Mo will either go home tonight or will file his Sunday piece today or ~~xxxx~~ tomorrow and then go home to collapse. He told me he'd phone me tomorrow. I am by no means sure he will. He may well be worn out.

However, I'm pretty sure I'll learn what Lane wanted to speak to him about.

And perhaps whether Sprague told Lane that Mo was in Washington.

Normally it is Trenton.

And after last year's Hartford CCI meeting Lane was pissed-off because Mo lumped him and Cecil Rolleston together, Mo says.
