Snow blower is great and I got up feeling fine, so after daylight I set out with it and found the usual problems x with wet snow-jams in the driveway. But I employed it, cleared the snow, which was less x wet, and with the thoughtfully volunteered aid of Janice's cousin, who did most of the shovel work, got the dead ends. When hours later the wind causes drifts, I cleared them and did the shovelling alone. Only about two hours later I got tired. But it is a joy to be able to do some hard work. Right now, thanks to National Inquirer and International Harvester, I'm pretty certain I'll not have last winter's problem with ice which are long-lasting. I've had it fixed. All I want's just sitting and resting and packaging the tapes so George can hear them. They may be part of a batch of which I sent you some earlier. Got them this past summer from Gandoife. ..Believe it or not, we still have four unfrozen, uncounted tomatoes 'til raised. Record for us. I used to make Thanksgiving omelet. Now I eat infrequently but if she doesn't use those first they'll go to February. And I just bought her a small electric inside "greenhouse," 12x18 inches, plastic clear cover, temperature set at 75, for her to start next summer's plants. Could start about 4 doz/ in small peat balls or pots.
