Comments on FBIHQ 62-109060 records mentioned in Paul Hoch's notes

Serial 859 is represented by a "Permanent Serial Charge Out" sheet of 11/30/63. The "Subject" is "June Mail," with only the identification of the assassination added. This is helpful in locating where these removed surveillance recrds are stored, "Has been removed and placed in the Special File Reom of Records Branch."

There remains, of course, the question who's mail? (In Section 11)

Serial 1002, Section 13, is classic Heover (in the note) and classic FRI in the leaking to Les Whitten of the coming FRI conclusions in its CD1. Hoover wrote on the story "I assume none of this is coming from FRI." DeLoach was no less sanctimenious, telling Mohr "We have given Les Whitten no information mixmix whatsoever." Technically it was true. It was not information. De Loach gilded the lilly by quoting Whitten as saying "he had 'good sources.'" (PH- Hoover was not worried. You should heed their cover-the-ass method!)

Serial 1042. Section 13 is the Losingeles forwarding of the Watley report. PH says "Davis informant?" The equals mark is correct. The ? can be removed. Hall and Hemming are hand noted for 105 files, "Internal Security-Nationalistic Tendencies." The file on Davis is 134-6356. 134 = "Security Informants."

Serial 1094, Section 14 represents the forwarding of the berrowed Secret Service copy of the Zapruder film with a request for two dubs to ve returned with it. HQ sent enly 1 dub, with caution for official use only. The Dallas language is Eastman Kedak ...developed original negative and three copies for ZAPRUDER." Well, this does represent their knowledge of film. It was a positive that was developed. However, of possible significance is the failure to state the total number of copies the Eastman lab made. This is limited to three copies for Z. Says nothing about pirated copies, no Dallas secret.

Serial 1115, Section 14. PH says it is a capy of the story provided to Jeremiah O'Leary by Lt. Denovon, which is accurate. The DeLoach te Mohr meno says O'Leary left a copy of his story and suggested that Donovan be interviewed. He had not been. He was the next day. The story O'Leary left was not the printed copy. It is a copy of the uncorrected typed draft. A little out of the ordinary for a normal reporter being helpful. Partictic, perhaps?

Serial 1132, Section 14 has two parts. The first suggests that they learn from Zapruder the f speed at which his camera was going. This might account for the Barrett report, which gives the wreng speed. The second discusses the Walker bullet without any mention of scientific testing. Cenrad (lab) refers only to how mutilated it was. (Dallas FD had already determined it was 30-caliber and hence not from the so-called Oswald rifle.) Cenrad's ignores this and lets it be believed that because of the mutilation it cannot be diment "whether the Walker slug had been fired from the assassination, rifle." Getting a 30 cal through a 6.5 mm barrel would make it a truly magic bullet. As Marina said, that is the FBI for you.

Serial 1167, Section 15 inadvertently discloses that a Chicage political infermer who provided the info on John Rossen a liberal. He was source not of FBI but of Mayer Daly's "soccial events." This is of interest to me because similar material, in great detail, reached the Minutemen, from who I obtained it years ago. I suggest the co-operation was between the Mayor's people or police and the MM source.

Serial 1188, Section 15, includes the unwanted information that there was a second Oswald helper in the Trade Mart lit. dist. project and what I do not recall from Steele's testimony, that Oswald told him at the outset the project would last only 15-20 minutes. (This would seem to indicate that Oswald expected TV coverage and at a certain time.) This TT coincides with what Steele and Jesse Core both told me about the tird man. I am surprised, however, that it took a day for WWL to speak to the FEI and that the FEI appears not to have spoken to it after knowing from WDSU of the TV coverage. Core and Planer, News Director, WDSU TV, both teld me that some footage had disappeared by the time the FEI returned the WDSU footage.

Mr. Whitten as well as literally hundreds of other reporters have, of course, called my office asking for information. We have treated Whitten the same as all the others and have answered "no comment" to him. Whitten did say, however, that he had "good sources," that he intended to "rewrite" much of the information that came from various news accounts emanating from Dallas, principally the interview with District Attorney Wade.

Report to LBJ Calls Oswald The Assassin

Hearst Headline Service Special to N. Y. Journal-American WASHINGTON, Nov. 27.—FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover expects to have his report of the slaying of President Kennedy by Lee Harvey Oswald in President Johnson's hands by Friday at the latest.

The report, it was learned, will elte evidence—some of it unrevealed so far—establishing "beyond reasonable doub!" that Oswald, 24, was the killer of President Kennedy.

56 IN DALLAS

Mr. Hoover, who put more than \$0 men on the Dallas aspects of the case and scores more in his 55 field offices, will also make these two major points, it was secured.

- There is no evidence thus far to indicate Oswald was ordered to murder President Kennedy by any groups—Communist, Trotskylto or other subversives.
- o But a raft of Communist literature, letters and other documents, plus Oswald's background and interviews with his acquaintances establish he was philosophically attuned to the violent aspects of the Communist movement. The report will indicate that, if only indirectly, the discipline of Marxism played a part in his mur-

EUROPE REPORTS

The reports have sprung up mainly in some sections of continental Europe where a long tradition of government deception of the people, particularly under dictatorships, gives grounds for popular suspicion.

"There is no evidence of any kind of plot, or conspiracy in this thing," said a Federal official close to the Oswald probe, even after President Johnson acts the report and releases it, honever, the investigation will continue. Dallas police have furned over all their evidence in the FBI.
