When they are eating, just contented, not jealous or excited, their low chatter is, I guess, best called gobbling. Sometimes they eat in silence except when they are mated. Depending on what they are eating, they can make other noises, like when they crack something with their powerful, serrated mandibles.

I have no knowledge of their sense of smell, have never seen any demonstration of it that I recognized as such.

I believe they do remember, and rather well. People, incidents, animals, paths. It might be difficult to distinguish between remembering and instinct and habit. I consider them very intelligent for fowl. Wish ^ had time for more. I've stopped other things not to forget to answer.
