In December, 1976, the FBI requested that the Archivist make available to the FBI two test bullets fired from Oswald's rifle. After initially approving this request, the Archivist them denied the request based upon an agreement between the Archivist and the HSCA. By letters dated 3/11/77 and 4/28/77, the Department was requested to resolve this matter and to delineate the jurisdiction of this Bureau. DETAILS: By letter dated 5/4/77, the Archivist of the United States advised that the FBI could have access to two test bullets fired from the rifle of Lee Harvey Oswald under the conditions that a representative of HSCA and a representative of the National Archives be present during testing procedures. These conditions are not acceptable.

By way of background, in December, 1976, a Dallas resident furnished to the FBI a bullet allegedly found in the vicinity of Dealy Plaza, the site of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. Since January, 1977, the Archivist has refused the FBI access to the test bullets from the Oswald rifle at the request of HSCA.

By memoranda dated 3/11/77 and 4/28/77, the Department has been requested to resolve this issue and to delineate the jurisdiction of the FBI in order to avoid duplication of investigative effort with the HSCA. These issues remain unresolved.

It is recommended, therefore, that the letter to the Archivist be approved which would acknowledge receipt of his letter and the memorandum to the Attorney General be approved advising the Department of the continuing impasse and of the anticipated course of action by the FBI regarding the bullet found in Dallas. This has been coordinated with the Laboratory Division.

The Archivist of the United States has denied this access to the FBI at the request of HSCA. Enclosed is a copy of the most recent letter of Dr. James B. Rhoads, Archivist of the United States, dated May 4, 1977, with enclosures, which sets out the conditions under which this Bureau may gain access to the test bullets, originally turned over to the Archives by the FBI in 1964. Also enclosed is a copy of this Bureau's acknowledgement of that letter deted May 10, 1977.

The FBI cannot agree to this compromise which directly impugnes the integrity of this Bureau and attacks the validity and trustworthiness of our Laboratory examination, nor can this Bureau comprehend how such encroachment by the on an investigative matter within the criminal jurisdie tion of the FBI is a proper legislative function. 7.
