Mr. Miller stated Mrs. Lincoln, who has offices at the Archives, at the request of Mrs. John Kennedy is seeking information as to the location and availability of the clothing worn by the late President Kennedy at the time he was assassinated.

According to Miller, Mrs. Kennedy desires to obtain this clothing.
