JFK autopsy pic, L-rays

Better date of 5/10/01 Ray Thurman, unidentified, wrote a lengthy memo to Carl V. Bullock, chief of the General Counsel Section of the FBI Criminal Division, on the subject "Guidelines for the disclosure of materials relating to the assassination of President Kennedy."

I presume that Thurman was another lawyer in DC, whether or not in Criminal. Bullock has been very active in both the King and JFK assassination matters.

The really is talking about assassinations and almost entirely about the Government's records. She takes the firmest position that NSA exempted all investigation files under way and all conditions.

On page 4 she has a citation on the pic and L-rays in which she repeatedly refers to them as "presidential library records after transfer to the Archives." This seems to us to support the position I've always taken, that the alleged transfer was not to the family itself but was from one agency of government to another, presidential libraries being part of Archives.

I also find it interesting that on the same page she refers to me as "Frank 'Washington' Bullock" in connection with his/her conversations. I do not recall any of her records holding this reference nor do I recall any record from this file (W 129-012-5) referencing any such name or basis for it. I suspect she has other records not provided.

I do not recall any reference to any presidential library statute in the letter agreement. My recollection is that it merely states the transfer is because of historical interests but if the transfer is to the JFK Library, then as I've always claimed, "Bullock was in the Archives working not for the family but for the JFK Library. The transfer then was not to the family at that point, prior to the letter agreement."
