The Bureau is continuing extensive investigation even to the extent of compiling the names of every character appearing in all of Ian Fleming's books on James Bond. Statements from a prisonmate indicate that Ray stated a businessman's association had offered \$100,000 to kill people like King and that King was five years past due. This Section also revealed that one [redacted] (black power advocate) had (b)(7)(c) predicted King's death in Memphis shortly before it happened (b)(7)(c) [redacted] was uncooperative and the Bureau opened a "157" case on [redacted].
