

Henry Wade's personal effort to misdirect the news media and public thinking is reflected in this quote from a lengthy "review and assessment" prepared for release February 25, 1967, by UPI from the work of a "five-man reporting team" assigned "to put together a comprehensive assessment of Garrison's probe." UPI quotes Wade:

"Rumors were flying around that he (Oswald) was supposed to go to an airport and somebody was supposed to fly him away (after the assassination, but as far as I know there was nothing but rumors, 'Wade said."

From the same source, Garrison said: "There will also be, again in my judgement, convictions of individuals for being accessories after the fact, for having substantial knowledge of the conspiracy and withholding it and in other ways abetting it."

This quotation from Senator Russell Long, "If he turns up evidence of a conspiracy, it could lead to all sorts of possibilities, including the one that Oswald was the fall guy and the real killer is still free". He-Garrison.
