Dear Mr. Washburn,

Please forgive this paper as it was all I could find here today. It's a holiday & no one is in today. Got your letter last Monday and as usual am glad to hear from you.

I finally talked to Dr. Chapman, again tonight at 8 PM. He has evening hours w/pt at about 7 PM. I called at 7:30, his nurse Cumber is actually a friendly type woman on the phone, told me he was in w/ a patient. I told her I'd call back about 8, and did so. He just finished with his patient, and was in a hurry but came on the phone. I was in a hurry also, as we change assignment on the hour. He was friendly, told me his wife had just got out of the hospital & time was tight. He said he'd be glad to meet me once things settle down for him. I told him I have 4 days off next week (Dec 4-7) and that seemed OK w/ him. I told him I'd call him wed or Friday to set up a time. Hope it goes through this time.
