Morton 'Favor' Aided Developers

Before Rogers C. B. Morton left the Interior Department, Sen. Paul J. Fannin (R-Ariz.) called upon him as one Republican to another for a small favor.

The senator wanted the Kofa Game Range in Arizona taken away from the Fish and Wildlife Service and put under the sole jurisdiction of the Bureau of Land Management.

The BLM has a reputation for being soft on land development. Environmentalists, therefore, suspected that some powerful developers were behind the move and that the BLM would open the range for mining and other commercial uses.

Morton's advisers opposed giving the range to the BLM, but Morton overruled them. "It's the least I can do for Paul Fannin," he was heard to say.

. Environmentalists have alerted Rep. John D. Dingell (D-Mich.), who is investigating the transfer. He has found that all of the staff memos on the subject at the Interior Department favored putting the range under only Fish and Wildlife jurisdiction. The two agencies have shared jurisdiction.

A spokesman for Morton said the former Interior Secretary might have made the comment about Fannin but doesn't recall it. Morton decided to turn the range over to the BLM because local citizens wanted it, the spokesman said. The same point was made by a spokesman for

But the environmentalists are convinced that the decision was made so that developers, who support Fannin, can get their hands on the land.
