

Perspective on the publisher & his attitude (for Harper & Row claim they do this book without thought of or desire for profit), from Phila Inq 12/25/66:

"The publishers say the book is superbly written, is now an historical document and the public has a right to know of the events which shocked the nation".

Take each of these three things and deal with, esp what besides the manufactured scandal makes it historical, what "right to know" there is of slander, falsehood and misrepresentation, of gross historical and reportorial inaccuracy, and point out that there is no source in which there is less real information on "the events which shocked the nation" and certainly none in which what is presented as information is so overwhelmingly inaccurate.
