7. William C. Sullivan, the controversial former assistant director of the FBI—who directed J. Edgar Hoover's harassment of civil rights leader Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., and then later disclosed his actions to a Senate investigating committee and publicly questioned Hoover's mental stability—will continue to be a character of public controversy even after death. Actor Clu Gallagher will play the part of Sullivan in a movie now being filmed. The picture, entitled KING, co-stars Paul Winfield as the black minister who was assassinated in Memphis. Sullivan was shot to death in November in a hunting tragedy that New Hampshire officials have labeled accidental. The shooting followed by six months a mysterious fire which destroyed many of the files of the man who was the third most powerful member of the FBI while heading its counter intelligence program...conspiratorial theorists take note.
