FBI reports and the press have indicated that Martens and Arcacha were associated in New Orleans in 1961, when they solicited funds for an anti-Castro organization. The press has repeated assertions by Garrison's office that both Martens and Arcacha, as well as others, were involved in the robbery of a munitions bunker at Houma, Louisiana. According to one John W. Whelan, cited in an FBI report of 5 July 1968, Martens is under indictment in state court on a charge of perjury. The charge was levelled by Garrison.
