

Dear Dennis,

Your letter with its enclosure is a shocker!

I'm more than usually tired today and I'll go over it again tomorrow and then may write you more.

I had to abort my physical therapy thing morning because less than half of what I was doing with more resistance three weeks ago was too much. Then I went to the dentist and then return to the physical therapists for treatment. I've not been this tired in some time.

Have you any idea what could have happened? I assume that what she gave me after such long delay is a loused-up duplicate of the original.

That she was totally nonresponsive for so long in itself is suspicious.
