JFK ASSASSINATION REVEALED BY LEADING  
LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER

Nine years after the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, Hugh C. McDonald met his real murderer face to face in a hotel in Europe. McDonald had met the killer once before - in the CIA headquarters in Washington following the Bay of Pigs invasion. Their second meeting, in June 1972, was the result of a search that had taken McDonald almost three years, across fifty thousand miles, through ten countries, at a cost of somewhat over thirty thousand dollars.

McDonald's search for the assassin was conducted with all the thoroughness and all the professional resources that have come to him after forty years in law enforcement. McDonald has held positions ranging from second in command of the military intelligence school at Ft. McArthur, California, one of the largest installations in the country - to Chief of Detectives for the Los Angeles County Sheriff's office. He is the inventor of the Identi-Kit, a photographic identification system used by police throughout the world. He has worked in private industry, as a specialist in industrial security for Hughes Aircraft, and has developed and tested police planes and helicopters, including the Sky Sentinel. In 1964, he

was hired by Presidential candidate Barry Goldwater as Chief of Security. McDonald first learned that Lee Harvey Oswald was not the assassin - but a pitiful dupe set up to be murdered by the real killer or a back-up team - in 1964, during the course of the Goldwater campaign. McDonald had in his employ his former CIA "mentor" or contact man, Herman Kimsey, who revealed to him the actual events of November 22, 1963.

Kimsey's story tied in the assassin with the man McDonald had previously met at the CIA, but it wasn't until McDonald saw his photo in the Warren Commission report that he decided he had to validate Kimsey's statement. When he tracked down and met the assassin in 1972, the man confirmed almost detail for detail the story that Herman Kimsey had related to Hugh McDonald.

The details of McDonald's search and the assassin's confession, plus formerly classified photos of the killer, are contained in a book being released on November 6th. The Zebra II publication, entitled APPOINTMENT IN DALLAS: THE FINAL SOLUTION TO THE ASSASSINATION OF JFK, is by Hugh C. McDonald as told to Geoffrey Bocca.
