As phase one of our publishing plan we would - in accordance with what I understand to be the defense team's wishes - like to interview Jimmy on his incarceration and before. In short, to give the American magazine audience an important feeling for James Earl Ray as a sensible human being, caught as he says, in a trap.

If this sounds feasible to you and Messrs. Fandrewald and Livingston, I must soon at least discuss it with you on these issues: ① asking Jimmy if this is agreeable with him ② arranging for your participation in the interview so as not to imperil any future judicial proceedings ③ the terms, financial and otherwise, for the interview - including that of exclusivity for Playboy of this sort of "human portrait" interview i.e. an interview on matters after rather than of direct public testimony.

If, however, this seems impossible

or highly improbable, I would greatly appreciate learning this soon so that you could be spared my inquiries and entreaties.

Thanks for the consideration, and I must add that I will be available any time subsequent to his hearing for the interview. Yrs.
