What not write them a nice polite letter about this all being unfinanced, pro bono, and can they send you a list or better, xeroxes that would be so much appreciated? Burch offers "copying" and it would take one helluve file for paying for maroxing not to be cheaper than just air fare. Get it all! Even if they have an inglated charge for xeroxing it will be much cheaper.

I'd ask the sheriff for a copy of all the visitors and of any mail log in writing him a ni ce thank you letter.
